Seven Things You Ought to Do

Welcome teachers, organizers, parents, and sponsors! Below is a checklist of seven things you should do before organizing or teaching Bible studies or classes with this ministry.

$\underline{\hspace{0.1cm}}$ 1. Read and accept the 3 goals of this ministry (they are not a statement of faith)

Note: They are listed on the inside front cover of the Free Teacher Guide. You should learn about them so that you will be aware of the overall meaning and purpose of this ministry and what I believe God wants to accomplish with it. If you accept the three goals by saying "Yes", I thank God for this! Then we can work together with you to reach them in unity, not division.
2. Read "Tips for Advertising, Organizing, Teaching" on Page 55
This should help you (and your assistants) be even more successful in organizing or teaching Bible studies and classes with this ministry.
3. Review the "Bible Study Outlines" on Pages 13-15
There are three of them; one for each level of study. This will give you a quick orientation, overview, and understanding (scope and sequence) of the Bible study books, tests, and quizzes which you will

___ 4. Plan your Free Bible School class or study

use throughout each level of study.

First, decide which group of people it is fitting for you to organize or teach, such as your family, friends, co-workers, church, community, or city. If you do not have anyone to organize or teach, if you cannot register anyone for a Bible study or class, well then you cannot have a Bible study! So obviously, you must have, find, or register people for it.

Second, decide <u>which level of study</u> you will organize or teach (I recommend starting with Level 1 - Advanced Chronological Study of the Holy Bible). Then continue on with either Level 2 - Advanced Bible Study on Christian Worship, or Level 3 - Advanced Bible Study on Spiritual Gifts. Yet, the 3 Levels were designed to be completed in 1, 2, 3 order.

Third, decide on the length of your study (1/2 hour, 1 hour, 2 hour, other). The Lesson Plans in this Free Teacher Guide are for 1/2 hour, 1 hour, and 2 hour Bible study/class formats. For my family, I use a daily 1/2 hour Bible study format almost every evening (since we also sing and pray and do other things together for about 1 - 1.5 hours total). For my city or church, I have organized and/or taught 1 hour, 2 hour, and even 3 hour weekly classes (for certain groups requested a 3 hour class).

Fourth, decide on the frequency of your study (once a week, every day, one weekend, other). It may be best for you to coordinate the length (1/2, 1, 2 hour, other) and the frequency (daily, weekly, weekend, other), including the day and time and location of the class with the actual people in your class. This may lead to more being able to attend your study. You can do this when you begin to register students for class. Ask each registrant about it.

____ 5. Announce/Advertise your Free Bible School class or study

You must register students for your class or study. Start to invite, advertise, or announce your study to the ones you wish to organize or teach (your family, friends, community, church, or group). You can use the Free Bible School advertisements that come with the Free Download of the Free Teacher Guide. I rely on the Free Bible School brochure and EDDM mailer the most. They work for me the best to register students for my class. Please make sure you put your own registrar contact information on the advertisements, such as a phone number and postal address. People sign up both by phone and by mail. If you already know the exact date, time, and location of your class, it would be good to list it on the advertisements and invitations.

Note: Obviously, some people do not need to be registered at all, like your family or any others who will certainly go through the studies with you (like if you are already teaching a group of Christians). But others, like co-workers, people in your community, and some Christians will need to be given a clear choice to register for it or not (through your invitation, registration brochure, advertisements, etc).

____ 6. Prepare your materials and/or teach the class or study

When you know how many people will be attending your class, prepare your materials for it.


Notes: You ought to carefully follow the Lesson Plan in this guide for the level of study you will organize or teach. It will alert you to what lessons, quizzes, or tests you need to prepare before you conduct each day of class. There are several ways you can provide materials for your class. First, order printed copies of a level of study using the order form near the beginning of this guide, or order printed copies online at FreeBibleStudy.org (Each printed book you order from this ministry comes with all tests and quizzes. You will also receive an Answer Key for them). You can print the Free Ebook PDF Downloads and tests and distribute them, or you can print the free Online lessons and tests and distribute them (you receive access to them when you register for free Online and Download study at FreeBibleStudy.org). You can somehow share "digital copies" of the studies and tests with your class, such as PDF Ebooks, or online lesson pages and tests. If you cannot share lessons with your class, whoever is teaching will need a copy (digital or printed) of a study to teach with. Remember to use the "Quizzes for Each Lesson of a Study" (starting on page 61 of this Teacher Guide) to help each member of your study learn and use the Scriptures taught in each lesson.

The Purpose of This Guide

I created this Free Teacher Guide to help us successfully organize or teach Bible studies, classes, or seminars with our families, friends, community, or church using my free advanced 3-Level Bible study for men, women, and teens. These studies have been used worldwide by tens of thousands of people. The three levels of study reflect the three ministry goals. First, to help everyone be saved from their sins by the gospel of Jesus Christ. For "the gospel... is the power of God for salvation to everyone" (Ro 1:16). Second, to help everyone be the kind of worshipers whom God seeks, "True worshipers... for such people the Father seeks to be His worshipers" (Jn 4:23). I myself have used this Free Teacher Guide to successfully organize or teach many Free Bible School classes in my community, church, and home (even with my children & friends), on the internet, on the phone, through the postal mail, etc. And so I know that it works. Someone should be "baptizing them" and be "teaching them to observe all things" that Jesus has commanded us to practice (READ Mt 28:18-20). And so I encourage you to use this Free Teacher Guide to help you organize or teach Bible studies with everyone whom God gives you an opportunity to serve (whom the Lord calls you to organize or teach, like your family or friends), and for the

true purpose of helping them to grow up in every aspect of the gospel of Jesus Christ, to mature them in Christ, to teach them how to observe and practice all that Christ commanded. Are the people whom God has called you to serve in the gospel growing in their faith in the Son of God, in every aspect, like your family, your children, your friends, or your coworkers, your church, or even your community? Yet, it does not list any of the details necessary for teaching an entire level of study (you will need the Lesson Plans for this).

Next are Lesson Plans/Guides which list. step by step, all of the details that you will need to know in order to organize or teach an entire course or level of study. day by day, or week by week. There are three Lesson Plans/Guides for each course/level of study, in half hour, one hour, and two hour, formats. So there a total of nine Lesson Plan/Guides, three per study level. You must choose which Lesson Plan/Guide works best with your family, friends, or group; a two hour, one hour, or a half hour Bible study format. Next are Seminar Guides to help you successfully conduct a one-time advanced Bible study, for approximately two hours. There are three Seminar Guides, one for each advanced level/course of study. 56

Next, to help you to reinforce the Scriptures used in each Bible study, I created Quizzes for Each Lesson in a Study. You can use them as a verbal Question and Answer session with your group (before or after you teach on a specific lesson). It is a great way to get them to memorize, verbalize, and apply the Scripture (which is the sword of the Spirit!). Help them to use that sword.

Finally, I have put some things throughout this Free Teacher Guide to help you succeed. For example, at the front, there is an Order Form so that you can get printed Bible studies for your family, friends, or group. On the back cover, there are examples from organizers and teachers to encourage you and to give you ideas on how to use this Free Teacher Guide and the advanced 3-Level Bible study. At the back, there is an answer key for the multiple choice questions for each level of study. Yet, when you register online for this Free Teacher Guide, you will receive a free download of the Answer Keys to all levels of study, along with this Free Teacher Guide and all the other related files (yet to get the studies, you use the online ones, or register for Free Download studies, or order printed studies).

Be Called and Equipped to Teach Someone

First and foremost, make sure that you have been called by God and that you are being equipped by Him (like through this ministry) to organize or teach the people you wish to teach (the advanced 3-Level study and this guide can help you do it!). Second, be warned. James said that not many of us should become teachers, because those who teach will receive a stricter judgment than those who do not teach (SEE James 3:1-12). So pay careful attention to yourself and your

1 Tim 4:16). Third, evidently parents themselves, especially fathers, have been called by God to be teaching their children (SEE Eph 6:4), and certain women have been called by God to be teaching and encouraging and strengthening certain other women (SEE Titus 2:3-5), and grandmothers have been known to teach their grandchildren, and so on and so forth. And so while James said that not many of us should become teachers, it is also obvious to us that many of us have to become teachers. So there are a variety of situations or roles in life in which we find ourselves that God expects us to be teaching others. Fourth, when it comes to teaching, James said that our tongue is the problem. It is incomplete, immature, and very damaging, like a match that sets things on fire to destroy them (but it is really our heart which is the problem, because our tongue speaks from the heart). It is also duplistic and impure, like a fountain that gives both saltwater and pure water. But a perfect man, a man who is truly mature in his teaching, will not stumble as much as the rest in his speaking. It is all about the truth, speaking the whole truth of God's word, and also obeying it, practicing it ourselves. Finally, I recommend two things to help you fully discover your God given callings and abilities to organize or teach others or certain groups in the kingdom of God.

Finally, I recommend two things to help you fully discover your God given callings and abilities to organize or teach others or certain groups in the kingdom of God. First, complete the Advanced Bible Study on the Greater Gifts, including the tests for all of the five greater gifts. Second, you yourself ought to complete the entire 3-Level advanced study to fully train and equip yourself on many levels of God's word. And you ought to use it to fully teach and equip those you are called to teach. For in studying and teaching, we teachers can learn the most. It is where conviction (faith) can come the most.

Be Organized for Class

First, be prepared for class. For example, have all handouts ready, such as tests or quizzes. Whoever is teaching should study/read the lesson material for the class and related Scriptures. Second, use the Bible Study Outlines, Lesson Plans/Guides, or the Seminar Guides to help you organize and prepare for each study, class, or seminar, every day. Third, make sure that the students know how the Bible class will be managed, and servingly, hold them to it! This will help you to successfully reach the goals of this ministry. Finally, it will be difficult to fit in all the material in the allotted time period. So the best way to get it all in is to (1) be prepared to do so, and (2) stick to it, manage the class in a way that it/they help you to accomplish it!

For example, if you cannot cover all material in a class day, assign it as a reading lesson while outside of class (home work). I even do this with tests. I ask them to complete them at home and bring them to class the next time. If you or someone needs more time to discuss things, plan for it before class or after the class is dismissed. In this way those who wish to stay can stay, and those who wish to leave can leave. People have schedules! People have other responsibilities or callings! You have other callings! Respect schedules and callings. But make sure you do them a grace, and get through all the material some how, so that they can all have a chance to learn and grow the most.

How to Use Quizzes & Tests

There are tests and guizzes in all levels of study which are to be corrected by you and returned to students. The Lesson Plans/Guides list what test or guiz you should give to the students, and on what class day you should aive it to them. [When I do not have enough time left in a class day for students to complete the test in class. I ask them to complete it at home and return it for grading the next time we meet for class.] Encourage students to answer discussion auestions with Scripture, the sword of the Spirit! Written guizzes and written tests are all open Bible, open workbook.

Notes: You can make copies of guizzes and tests from your own printed copies to hand out to students, or print quizzes and tests directly from the PDF Download Test Files you received when you registered for Free Download Bible Studies at FreeBibleStudy.org. Or simply use the tests that come with each copy of a printed Bible study which you ordered from FBS (for each individual study you order from FBS comes with a complete set of tests).

If a student answer the discussion questions well, meaning they quote the Scripture and use it correctly, you can give them a "Sword-Award!" (or say "Sword Award!" next to their answer). This encourages them in quoting and using Scripture in their discussion answers. This is a good goal.

For grading a discussion question, depending on how well and fully a student answers the question (with Scripture), I give them a full point (fully answered well with Scripture), 1/2 point (answered only half the question well with Scripture), 0 point (did not answer the question well, and with no Scripture). So I give 1, 1/2, and zero points per discussion question.

Yet, in this Free Teacher Guide, there are "verbal" auizzes for each lesson of a study. You can use them before or after you teach on a lesson subject, to test and equip the students on the word of God. At first, when you ask people a question from these guizzes, many times they will only answer with what they think, without giving any fitting Scripture proof as evidence. I urge you to get them in the habit of quoting God's word along with their own answers to discussion questions, guizzes, and tests. Like Jesus, encourage them to say, "It is written," not "My opinion is," or "I think." We want everybody to know and to speak the truth of God's word (which is the revelation of God's mind), not simply an opinion (which in the Scripture means guessing or speculation from one's own mind, not God's).

Finally, after you return a corrected quiz or test, review the answer key for it (i.e. the discussion question answer key) in class. Also allow time for a question and answer session about it.

How to Teach Lessons

First of all, encourage whomever is teaching to spend enough time in preparation with the subject, lessons, and Scriptures for that specific day (read them, study them, practice them out loud, embellish them, pray about them, 58 etc.). Plan to read lessons out loud to your class, or have them read it out loud to each other. Second, aim to complete the lesson(s) you have planned for that day in the specific time frame you have set aside. I do not recommend going beyond the time frame (remember, this is supposed to be a scheduled and well managed Bible study, but it won't be if you yourself are not). Third, if you want students to have a copy of a lesson or Bible study for class, (1) print them directly from the PDF Ebook Download files you received when you registered for Free Download Bible Studies at FreeBibleStudy.org, (2) make copies from your own set of printed studies or (3) have students get their own free downloads for printing when they register for Free Online/Download Studies at FreeBibleStudy. org. (4) Today, you do not need to print lessons because you can view them (internet or PDF downloads) on your cell phone. So, if you cannot print lessons for your group, somehow let them view them from their cell phones, either with a download or viewing the related internet lesson pages from FreeBibleStudy. org. I have taught my family by viewing/ reading my lessons on the internet with my cell phone. Finally, you can order printed Bible studies (including all tests for a study) online or by using the Order Form at the beginning of this guide.

How to Award Certificates

Print certificates from the PDF downloads you received when you registered for the Free Download Teacher Guide. Award a certificate to each student who satisfactorily completes a level of advanced study (for example, the student had satisfactory attendance and completed all tests).

Encourage 100 percent attendance with some sort of fitting reward, like a "Perfect Attendance" sticker on a certificate (likewise for "100% Correct" on multiple choice questions.

How to Advertise

If you want people to register for your FBS class, you must invite them through advertising. In this section, I list several proven and tested ways for you to successfully invite people to register for your FBS study (I personally tested them, in various ways, in various cities).

First, invite them to register for your class with the Free Bible School registration brochure. This has proven to be one of the most effective ways for me to reaister people for class. The brochure lists enough of the benefits of the advanced 3-Level Bible study and school, and encourages people to complete the reaistration form in it and return it to you. So you must somehow put your contact information on it. I recommend that you mail this Free Bible School brochure directly to homes in your community (or mail the Post Office EDDM Mailer that comes in your free Teacher Guide download. It is an 8.5 x 11, poster like mailer, that has worked to register students for class). Be sure to put your contact information on these advertisements.

Notes: You can make printed copies of the registration brochure directly from the PDF files you received when you order the FREE DOWNLOAD version of this Free Teacher Guide at FreeBibleStudy. ora. On each advertisement, there is a place for you to put your contact information.

Or you can simply invite people by word of mouth. For example, when I was a computer software engineer for a large multinational consulting company, when evangelism was my part-time hobby, not my full time work, I personally asked certain coworkers if they were willing to have a Bible study with me during lunch. Some of them knew Christ, and others did not. In response to my invitation, one man said, "What is a Bible study?" And so I told him and he was willing to join me. And so, when a person was willing (whether he knew Christ or not), I then scheduled a private Bible study with each individual for a half hour, for example on a Tuesday during our lunch together (in one of our corporate meeting rooms). So you can invite people with whom you are acquainted. You can also invite/register people with a variety of other advertisements, such as the following classified newspaper or bulletin board advertisements. Advertisements work. 59

There are many other ways to successfully advertise for this Bible course, like banners, yard signs, bumper stickers, car magnets, etc. Simply put one of the above classified advertisements on a banner, yard sign, or business card, etc. They work! I have used them many times. Signage works! Again, signage works! I have even advertised these free studies on Christian television and Christian radio. Or, in the USA, you can use our 8.5 x 11 inch Postal Mailier/ Every Door Direct Mailer (EDDM), for an easy way to mail direct to homes in your community in the USA, route by route, one route at a time, or up to about 5,000 homes maximum at a time.

Finally, if you do not have anybody to organize or teach, well then you do not have a free Bible school/study ministry! So, it is important to have a calling to teach, like your family, or your grandchildren, or your acquaintances, or your coworkers, or a church, or certain groups within a church, your neighbors, or people who respond to vour advertisements in your city.

Miscellaneous

First, Level 1 (The Advanced Chronological Study of the Holy Bible) is for the most part a chronological course of the Bible. And so, you have a wonderful opportunity to cover any and all important verses/truths from Genesis through the book of Acts, all of which is for the most part arranged chronologically. Second, for different reasons, some people will want to complete an entire advanced study more than once. Let people know that they can complete a level more than once, if they wish. For example, one student in my class completed the Advanced Chronological Study of the Holy Bible five times in a row. And when I had visited a student at home, the Advanced Worship Study was laying open on a table, and this student was highlightina certain parts of it with a marker. So, some people are very serious about learning the holy Scriptures. Praise God! At the end of a level, when you award certificates of completion, invite the students to sign up to complete the course again, if they wish. Perhaps someone wants to get 100% correct on all multiple choice questions for a level of study. In spite of it being a finish the Bible verse multiple choice test, in my experience as a teacher, I noticed that it is difficult for an student to get 100% correct. But some have tried and succeeded. Even with finish the verse multiple choice questions, most students get some wrong. We are not as careful as we think we are! Third, though desirable, you do not have to study with the people in your area. For example, I have had a weekly phone Bible study with someone in another state who accepted my invitation to do so. Fourth, it will truly be a powerful help to you if you can find Christians who will support your Free Bible School efforts in the way in which they are gifted. I praise God for all of the individuals and churches who have supported me with their talents while I organized and taught these courses to others. I have sweet memories of them. But I also have very sour memories of unreliable, unstable, and even sinful Christians sabotaging the whole effort. So, you need supportive people, if you can find some. I hope and pray that you do, since working together, two by two, or whatever, is good and desirable and can help the class the most. Yet, it may be wise for you to run this ministry independently, so there will be no conflict of interest between your ministry and the goals of another ministry or person. Be warned, worshipers can be

divisive! Complete my Advanced Worship Study and you will see examples from the Scripture of what I mean. Finally, for whatever reason, religious people can mistreat teachers/leaders, in word and in deed! So, be prepared to suffer and grieve properly and fittingly as a true teacher of the words of Christ. Consider the prophets and Christ Jesus. Simply aim to fulfill your calling in spite of this (endure hardship, for love endures). And if you do so, you have succeeded in the sight of God. But know this, you will need a lot of agape love to endure the trials of teaching. It is like being a parent. Your children may humble you a lot, even your spouse! Remember, simply aim to find your calling and then fulfill it.

Consider Paul. At one time he could not teach in a certain area, even though he wanted to, because the Spirit of Christ would not let him (SEE Ac 16:7). At other times, Paul the Lord had to show Him who and where to teach, like the Macedonians (Ac 16:9, 10). Parents are called to teach their children (Deut 6:7; Eph 6:4). Baptizers are called to teach everything to the ones they baptize (SEE Mt 28:18, 19). So find your callinas. Fulfill them. But know this, if anyone wants to live right he will suffer, even suffer rejection (SEE 2 Tim 3:12). Likewise, I tell you, if anyone wants to teach right, he will suffer, even rejection. For example, when I said to my parents that it is hard for a rich man to be saved (and they were not rich by standards in the USA), my father began to rebuke/oppose me for saying such a thing. But my mother quickly and kindly said to him, "Pat, that is in the Bible". And then he stopped rebuking me. So, people will balk at the word of God. For they do not understand it. Have not heard it. Of are misusing it. Even more, it is very hard to swallow some things which Jesus said and commanded. People will not even want to taste it! And sometimes, if they do begin to taste it, they will spit it back out of their mouths, right at you! And they may even spit you out of their lives. Simply try to clean up the "food fight" mess! Simply fulfill your calling to whom you are called to serve, to the best of your ability. Keep looking to fulfill your calling to someone! Keep being a parent. Keep being a son. Keep being a daughter. Keep being an organizer. Keep being a teacher. Keep being a helper. Keep being whatever God called you to be. It's all about fulfilling your callings in spite of other people, including your family, and even yourself! Love endures all things. With much holy love and holy affection, Rick David.

Quizzes for Each Study/Lesson

How to Use the Quizzes

This section has valuable "group discussion" quizzes to help us successfully teach our families, friends, church or community group on the variety of subjects and Scriptures used in the advanced 3-Level Bible study. For example, there are quizzes for every lesson in the Advanced Chronological Study of the Holy Bible (Level 1). Quizzes are being added for Level 2 and Level 3 advanced studies.

They are arranged in chronological order, in the sequence of how the lessons are laid out in a Bible study. In this way we will be able to quickly find and use the quiz which relates to the specific subject and lesson of our Bible study class for that day.

If it seems fitting to you and the Lord, I highly recommend that you use (and reuse) a quiz each and every day of your Bible study or class (or until they master the quiz material). This should help the members of your family or group learn, remember, and become able to speak the Scriptures related to the subject matter of each Bible study. The repetition builds their knowledge and ability with the Scriptures. Indeed, these guizzes have been designed to help us answer with Scripture. Jesus answered with Scripture, and properly applied it, to overcome the misleading temptations of the Devil in His life (Mt 4; Lk 4). Yet beware! Eve quoted the word of God to the Serpent, but was persuaded by him not to obey it! So the goal of these quizzes is to encourage us to answer with Scripture, but keeping in mind we need to use it properly.

I have used these quizzes with my own family during our daily evening Bible study. Before I start teaching a lesson in a Bible study, I first use the related quiz for that lesson. I do not start teaching them the lesson until after we completely finish a quiz (or until they have mastered the quiz). So, when I teach (read), for example, the lesson titled "We can be saved by the grace of God," I quiz them on "Grace". I use the "Quiz on Grace" which is in this section of the Free Teacher Guide. But, since it is my family, I simply verbally "ask" them the auiz auestions, and let them answer out loud in our family meeting. [You can also ask a quiz question and have them write down their answer on a sheet of paper or you can print out a quiz and have them write their answers on it.]

Now, during a quiz, I usually do not correct their answers. My main goal is to get them, not me, to answer, but to get them to answer in a fitting way with Scripture to prove what they are saying. I also have them look up and read out loud the verses which relate to a quiz question [the verses are listed below to each quiz question]. So,

if they do not know the answer to a quiz question, if they cannot answer with Scripture, they must look it up, that is, the Scripture which goes with the quiz question and also read it out loud. Then, after they read the Scripture out loud, I again ask them the quiz question and tell them to somehow answer from the Scripture they just read.

Now during these discussion guizzes, I do not permit them to use their Bibles or the Bible study books to find answers (yet all graded written tests and written guizzes are open Bible, open workbook). I want them to know the Scriptures from the heart, and not always have to first search for them before being able to answer. I want them to have the word of God in their hearts. So before we start a quiz, I ask them to close their Bibles and their Bible study books. During the guiz, sometimes I have to remind them to close their Bibles and study books because they are looking for Scriptures to answer the guiz guestions. But the only time that they are permitted to look up answers is when I give them a Scripture related to a quiz question to read. Then, after they read it, they must close their Bibles.

Note: Along with each quiz question, I have listed only a few key verses for reference. This will help students find the answers, but not give them an exhaustive list of related Scriptures on a certain point. I do not want to be exhaustive on these quizzes. I simply want them to quickly find some answers to the quiz questions. I want the quizzes to move along in a quick fashion. This will leave more time for reading and teaching the lesson, which has more complete details. For if we are to keep to the schedule, we must then move quickly

through the quizzes. But with my family, since we study daily, we go slow, and do not try to keep the schedule. We are patiently thorough, since we have much more time daily together in the word as a family than simply a once a week class.

After we finish a quiz, I begin to read and teach the lesson out loud, for example, "We can be saved by the grace of God". Then, when we continue our half hour study toaether on another day (we usually do not get done with a subject in one evening), I again first quiz them thoroughly on "Grace," since we are continuing to study the lesson "You can be saved by the grace of God." Afterward, I notice that their answers are somewhat better. Then I continue to teach the lesson "We can be saved by the grace of God". And so on and so forth, day after day, continually, until I finish teaching on this subject. (But when I start another subject or lesson, I have a new quiz for them!) This has worked very, very well to build their knowledge and ability with the different subjects in the Bible and the Scriptures which relate to them. They are answering with Scripture.

Notes: In all of my Bible studies or classes I conduct (whether with my family, or another group, or in one on one studies), I use these quizzes, or specially selected questions from them. Before I administer a test, for example the Test on Salvation Part 1, to prepare them to do well on it, I may quickly go through, in rapid, all of the auizzes related to that lesson (such as, the Quiz on grace, Quiz on faith, Quiz on how Jesus said we must be saved, Quiz on how the apostles said we must be saved). I urge you to use these quizzes, in some fitting way, to build your students knowledge of the holy Scriptures used in the 3-Level advanced Bible study.


Level 1 Quizzes - Advanced Chronological Study ADVANCED CHRONOLOGICAL

Advanced Chronological Study of the Holy Bible Containing the Old and New Testaments

First, please read this lesson on Truth vs. Opinion to your group.

Before we start quizzing one another on the word of God, before we start discussing "the truth" out loud, in front of others, It seems fitting to me that we settle one very important issue; the difference between truth and opinion. [For one of the solemn duties of a teacher of the gospel is to "destroy" opinions (also called "speculations" SEE 2 Cor 10:5), because opinions can arrogantly contend against the truth and mislead disciples.]

One is a fact, the other is a guess (fiction). One is revealed, the other is hidden. One is accurate, the other is theory. One we know, the other we do not know. One is evident, the other is speculative, speculation. One is commanded, the other is not. One is from God, the other is from man. One is required, the other is not and may be misleading, vain, misinterpreted, misapplied, or contrary to what is right. So if I tell you that it is daylight at 12:00 noon, I have just told you the truth, not my opinion. It is utterly evident that God created light and called it day. Likewise, He called the darkness night, and there was evening and morning one day. Now if I told you something contrary to this, well then, I would be, at best, opining, and at the worst, I would be very



wrong and misleading to someone.

Indeed, in the confines of the Scripture, as to how the Scriptures define it, thus how God defines it, is that "opinion" is "speculation"; guessing. It is not a commandment of the Lord. It is from one's own mind, not the mind of our Lord. For example, Paul said it himself: "Now concerning virgins I have **no command** from the Lord, but I give an opinion" (1 Cor 7:25). So before Paul speculated (opinionated) on this subject, before he guessed, Paul cleared himself by saying that he had no commandment from the Lord about whether or not virgins should or should not marrv. And so whatever Paul said on this subject is not binding. But in this chapter, he did say some things which were commandments from the Lord. These are binding. [In Romans 14:1, there is more teaching concerning "opinions". In 1 Timothy 1:4, the concept of opinion is sometimes translated and defined as "speculation".]

Yet an "application" of <u>a commandment</u> is not an "opinion". It may be a **proper** application of a commandment or it may be a <u>misapplication</u> of a commandment. For example, baptizers have been commanded to baptize those who believe the gospel (Mk 16:16; Mt 28:19). The proper application of this

verse is water immersion, "buried" (Ro 6:4; Col 2:12). A misapplication of this verse would be to sprinkle. But some are making an "application" where there is no commandment at all. For example, some so called "Anabaptists" say, "Since at one time Jesus refused to be made king (Jn 6:15), Christians must not be a part of the government." Obviously, this is an opinion (speculation). Jesus refusing to be made king at one time, by force, is not a commandment, and so there is no application to be made for us. It is a strange teaching, foreign to the teaching of the gospel.

In conclusion, instead of saying, "My opinion is," or, "I have a different opinion," or, "I think," or, "Everyone is entitled to his own opinion," we Christians ought to say, "It is written". Answer with Scripture. Answer with the truth of God's word, and apply it with wisdom, not folly. Don't make an application where there is no commandment. And don't make your own opinion a commandment or an application of a commandment, since there is no commandment on that subject. And so, before you speak about "the truth" to others, especially to other disciples, make sure it indeed is the truth that you are saying, and not simply your own opinion, which came from your own mind, not God's.

Three Time Saving Ideas

If you need to save time, or if you do not have time to do a quiz for a certain lesson, you can do the following. (1) Only do some, not all, of the quiz questions. You do not have to do all of the quiz questions. You can pick a few of them, perhaps two or three, and only go over them together with your group. (2) You do not have to do all of the quiz questions in one class setting. You can spread the quiz questions out over several days of class. For example, you can do questions 1-6 on day one, questions 6-12 on day two, and so on and so forth. You can increase or decrease the amount of questions you do based on the length of time or days you have left for a lesson. (3) You do not have to take the time to answer any of the quiz questions. You can simply read the quiz questions out loud without you or your group answering them. In this way, you will alert the class as to which questions the lesson answers. Then you can simply read the lesson, and it will answer the questions for you. This is both a time saver and an alert to the class as to what to expect from a certain lesson.

Quiz on Introduction

Lesson: Introduction to the Bible for believers & skeptics

Alert! If students cannot answer a quiz question in a fitting way, with Scripture, ask them to look up and read out loud the verses associated with it to find and give the answer themselves. Your goal is to let them answer from the Scripture, not you. Let them search the Scriptures, like the noble minded Bereans did (SEE Ac 17:11). Let them get knowledgeable and articulate in the word of God. For when you read the lessons, then you yourself will be giving a thorough answer or explanation and more!

Remind them to "Please answer with Scripture".

- 1. Why was the Bible written? Why was the Old Testament written? Why was the New Testament written? [First, read them the question and see how they answer it. Then have them read out loud Galatians 3:23-25: Jn 20:31. Then, if need be, let them answer the auestion again. Do the same thing for the rest of the quiz questions. So the O.T. was written to prepare and lead the Jews to Christ, and the N.T. was written to prove that Jesus is the Christ, and how we can be saved from our sins through faith in Him. So the entire Bible was written to lead us to God's Son, Jesus Christ, who is the savior of the world.]
- 2. What does the word "Christ" mean? [The King/Anointed One (1 Kings 1:34; Matthew 27:37), The Messiah (John 1:41), The Son of God (Matthew 16:16), The Son of Man/a Human (Luke 18:31; Matthew 1:1)]
- 3. What is the gospel of Jesus Christ?[1 Corinthians 15:1-5]
- 4. Why is the gospel of Jesus Christ

- "according to the Scriptures" (1 Corinthians 15:3, 4). Which "Scriptures" is this talking about? [Luke 24:44]
- 5. Name a prophecy about the Christ which Jesus fulfilled in the Law of Moses, the Prophets, and the Psalms. [The Law (Deuteronomy 18:15), The Prophets (Isaiah 53), and The Psalms (Ps 22:6-8, 11-18)]
- 6. How does the Bible's reliability compare to other ancient books? How many ancient copies of the New Testament are there compared to other ancient books? How reliable is the actual text of the Bible compared to other ancient books (in regards to the copy making process, corruptions, etc.)?

- 10. How many men did God use to write the New Testament? What were their names? [It seems that eight men were used to write it; Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, Paul, Peter, James, and Jude.]

- **not?** [These do not: Mt, Mk, Lk, Jn, Ac, He, 1 Jn, 2 Jn, 3 Jn.]
- 12. Which N.T. writer was supposedly a Gentile? [Luke]
- 13. What kind of credibility, experience, or training did the writers of the N.T. have? [Four were apostles (Luke 6:13-16), Two were traveling companions of an apostle (Acts 12:25; 16:10 "we" "us"), Two were relatives of Jesus (Mark 6:3; Acts 1:14; Galatians 1:19; Jude 1)]
- 14. What are two main kinds, categories, or styles of Bible "translations"? Name several examples of both kinds of Bibles. [Literal Bibles (direct quote, word for word), such as the NASV, KJV, ESV, etc. The other is interpretive Bibles / Interpretations (paraphrasing, restating, adding to or suppressing words/thoughts, not strictly quoting), such as the NRSV, Gender-Neutral versions, Amplified Bibles, easy to read versions, etc.]
- 15. Which kind of Bible translation is more reliable and why?
- 16. What is a "Gender-Neutral" Bible translation? Why is it misleading, especially in its name or title?
- 17. What is wrong with the Jehovah Witness New World Translation?
- 18. What is the book of Mormon? Is it a translation of the Bible?
- 19. Give three reasons why other books are not in the Bible. [Jude 3, Galatians 1:6-9, Revelations 22:18, 19]

The Patriarchal Age, Abraham and his near descendants were called the **patriarchs** (Hebrews 7:4; Acts 7:8, 9), 3. The Mosaic Age, Moses received the law from God, and it was the time when "the Law of Moses" (Lk 24:44) was in

- effect, 4. The Christian Age, it is simply the day or time of Christ (John 8:56)]
- 5. Which book covers the time of the beginning? How long did it last? [Genesis, specifically chapters 1-11; estimated length 2,000 years.]
- 6. Which book covers the time of the patriarchs? How long did it last? [Genesis from chapter 12-50; 600 years (400 of them were spent in slavery to Egypt (Genesis 15:13)]
- 7. Which books cover the time of Moses, the entire Mosaic Age? How long did it last? [Exodus through Malachi, including most of the gospel accounts of Jesus Christ (everything <u>before</u> Jesus shed His blood for our sins Lk 22:20); 1,433 years]

["The first covenant [Moses Law] was not inaugurated without blood" (Hebrews 9:18-22); "inaugurated" means to start or to begin. So it started when Moses sprinkled the blood, and it ended when Christ shed His blood to start "the new covenant in My blood" (Luke 22:20).]
- 9. Which books cover the time of Christ, the Christian Age? [The gospel accounts and the rest of the N.T.]
- 10. What specific thing marked the beginning or the start of the Christian Age or time period? When will it end? [Hebrews 9:18; Luke 22:20 (Christ's covenant, will, or age went into effect, started, or began when He shed His blood for our sins); We do not know when it will end on earth (Matthew 24:36), but some form of it will last forever in heaven.]
- 11. What do the abbreviations "B.C." and "A.D." mean? [Before Christ; Anno Domino is Latin for "in the year of our Lord"]

[1 Corinthians 6:9-11; For example, when a man wears a woman's clothing or when a woman wears a man's clothing, and things of a similar nature (Deuteronomy 22:5; 1 Corinthians 11:14, 15).]

14. Will homosexuals be saved? Why? What is the sin of homosexuality?

[1 Corinthians 6:9-11; Leviticus 18:22, 23 "perversion", meaning confusion, against the laws of God and nature; For example, God destroyed the cities of Sodom and Gomorah because the men and young men in them were perverts, homosexuals. But God saved Lot because he was straight, he was righteous (2 Peter 2:7, 8).]

15. Will thieves be saved? Why? What is the sin of thievery?

[1 Corinthians 6:9-11; John 10:10; For example, if a man kidnapped another person, he was to be put to death for being a "thief" (Duet 24:7).]

16. Will the covetous be saved? Why? What is the sin of covetousness?

[1 Corinthians 6:9-11; Exodus 20:17; For example, Jezebel coveted the land next to her property, and ended up murdering the owner to get it for her husband, Ahab (1 Kings 21:5-16).]

17. Will drunkards be saved? Why? What is the sin of drunkenness?

[1 Corinthians 6:9-11; Proverbs 20:1 "intoxicated"; For example, Jesus said that if one His servants begin to eat and drink with the drunkards [meaning those who are intoxicated], and also become neglectful and abusive to others because of it, He will not save that man, but in-

stead destroy him in hell (Matthew 24:45-51)].

18. Will revilers be saved? Why? What is the sin of reviling?

[1 Corinthians 6:9-11; Exodus 22:28; Acts 23:1-5; For example, Shimei reviled (spoke evil of) a leader of God's people, David (2 Samuel 16:7). But Michael the archangel did not revile (speak evil of) even the Devil (Jude 8-10). It's a form of blasphemy.]

19. Will swindlers be saved? Why? What is the sin of swindling?

[1 Corinthians 6:9-11; Leviticus 6:1-7 "extortion"; For example, God cursed His people who were swindling Him in the offering (Malachi 1:14). Consider Annanias and Sapphira (Acts 5:1-11). They were Christians who swindled, meaning extorted or cheated, God in the offering.]

20. Will the cowardly be saved? Why? What is the sin of cowardliness?

[Revelation 21:7, 8; Luke 9:26; For example, at one time Peter firmly denied the Lord, but later he repented and proved it by courageously proclaiming the gospel of Jesus Christ to everybody, even to the face of those who were responsible for the death of Jesus Christ (Acts 5:29-31).]

21. Will the unbelieving be saved? Why? What is the sin of unbelief?

[Revelation 21:7, 8; John 3:16; 36; 8:24; For example, the Jews were not able to enter the Promised Land because of their "unbelief", meaning they were "disobedient" to the word of God (Hebrews 3:18, 19).]

22. Will the abominable be saved? Why? What is the sin of abomination?

[Revelation 21:7, 8; Leviticus 18:30; For example, God gave the Promised Land to the Jews for two reasons. First, because of all the "abominations" of the people who lived in it (Leviticus 18:26-30), which included all kinds of sexual immorality, perversions, idolatry, cutting their flesh and making tattoo marks on their bodies (Leviticus 19:28), etc. Second, because God said he would give it to Abraham's descendents through Isaac (Deuteronomy 9:1, 4-6).]

23. Will murderers be saved? Why? What is the sin of murder?

[Revelation 21:7, 8; Deuteronomy 19:10; Proverbs 6:16, 17 "shed innocent blood"; For example, Paul repented of acting murderously against the followers of Jesus Christ. He proved it by serving them faithfully as a chosen apostle of Jesus Christ, even though he was persecuted mightily for it by the Jews and the Gentiles (Acts 9:1; 1 Timothy 1:12-17).]

24. Will the immoral be saved? Why? What is the sin of immorality?

[Revelation 21:7, 8; 1 Corinthians 6:18 "his own body"; 1 Thessalonians 4:3 "sexual"; For example, Jesus planned to bring wrath on Jezebel, and those who followed her teaching, because she would not repent of her immorality and her teaching others to do and practice the same (Revelation 2:20-23).]

25. Will sorcerers (meaning magicians, witchcraft) be saved? Why? What is the sin of sorcery?

[Revelation 21:7, 8; Deuteronomy 18:10; For example, Simon, "who formerly was practicing magic in the city and astonishing the people" repented and believed the gospel (Acts 8:9-13). In another place many magicians repented and proved it by burning their "magic... books" (Acts 19:18, 19).]

26. Will liars be saved? Why? What is the sin of lying?

[Revelation 21:7, 8; Ephesians 4:25; For example, Annanias and his wife Saphira died because they deceived their church about the full amount of their generosity to it (Acts 5:1-11).]

27. We must repent of even more sins to be saved. What are they?

[See the rest of this Advanced Study on the Holy Bible, and the Advanced Bible Study on Christian Worship, and the Advanced Bible Study on Spiritual Gifts]

Are there any other fitting questions on the subject of repentance from dead works?

Quiz on Confessing Jesus Christ

Lesson: We can be saved by Confessing Jesus is Lord & Christ

Remind them to "Please answer with Scripture".

- 1. What exactly is the gospel of Jesus Christ trying to get us to believe and to admitorsayinresponse to it? [John 20:31; Romans 10:8-10; Acts 9:22; 10:42; Etc.]
- 2. What does the Bible call it when someone admits to others with his own mouth that he believes that Jesus is Lord and Christ, the Messiah? [1 Timothy 6:12, 13]
- 3. Who made "the good confession" in the Bible? Name as many people as you can. What did they say? [The wise men said He was the King of the Jews (Matthew 2:2); John the Baptist (John 1:34); Andrew (John 1:40, 41); Jesus (1 Timothy 6:13; Mt 27:11); Peter (Matthew 16:15, 16); Martha (John 11:27); The Treasurer of Ethiopia (Acts 8:37); Paul (Acts 9:20); Timothy (1 Timothy 6:12); Etc.]
- 4. Why should we make the good confession and encourage others to do so through preaching the gospel to them? ["you will be saved... you confess and are saved" Romans 10:9, 10; 1 Timothy 6:12 "eternal life"]
- 5. How is "the good confession" different than any other kind of religious confession, such as a "personal testimony", confession or attestation to a man-made "statement of faith", or any other kind of religious confession or church confession?
- 6. Will God save everyone who says, "Jesus is Lord", everyone who makes the good confession? Why? [Matthew 7:21; 1 John 2:3, 4; Matthew 8:29 with James 2:19; Etc.]

- 7. Why do some people refuse to testify to others that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God? [John 12:42, 43; 1 John 4:3]
- 8. What will happen to us if we fail to "testify the good confession" before others? [Matthew 10:28, 32, 33; Revelation 21:8 "the cowardly"]
- 9. If we claim to be a Christian, but do not confess Jesus Christ to others, does this mean that we have the spirit of the anti-Christ, not the Spirit of Christ? [1 John 4:3]
- 10. All people will make the good confession that Jesus is Lord. When will this happen? Does this mean then that all people will be saved because of it, that absolutely none will be lost or go to hell? Why? [Isaiah 45:22, 23; Philippians 2:11; Romans 14:11]
- 11. When should we start to make the good confession to others? [We should be able to make it as soon as we are convinced that Jesus is Lord and Christ. and as soon as we want to be saved from our sins, as soon as we want to join Jesus Christ or His people. For example, as soon as the Ethiopian Treasurer realized that Jesus was the Lord, the Christ, He asked Philip, the evangelist, to baptize him. But Philip said to him that he first had to believe with all his heart. In response to this the Treasurer made the good confession. Then Philip baptized him (Acts 8:35-40). So before I baptize someone, I first find out if they truly believe in their heart that Jesus is Lord and Christ, and that God raised Him from the dead (Romans 10:8-10). If they do, then I baptize them. Afterward, I continue to teach them to make the good confession to others because it is a part of the Christian life.1

Are there any other fitting questions on the subject of confessing Jesus Christ to be saved?

Quiz on Baptism

Lesson: We can be saved by calling on the name of the Lord in water baptism

Remind them to "Please answer with Scripture".

- 1. Jesus Christ offered a great blessing, a magnificent promise to anyone who has believed in the gospel and has been baptized. What is it? [Mark 16:16]
- 2. He also offered a terrible curse, a promise to anyone who disbelieves the gospel. What is it? Do unbelievers get baptized for Jesus? [Mark 16:16]
- 3. From what will believers be saved? Where do the lost go after they die, those who disbelieve the gospel? Where will believers go after they die, heaven or hell? So from what will believers be saved? [John 3:16]
- 4. Peter, a close friend and an apostle of Jesus Christ, also offered to "everyone" two great and magnificent blessings or promises from God if they would repent and be baptized when they believe in the gospel of Jesus Christ. What are these two blessings or promises from God? [Acts 2:38]
- 5. What is the forgiveness of sins? [Forgiveness means "to pardon".]
- 6. What is the gift of the Holy Spirit? How is the gift of the Holy Spirit different than the gifts of the Holy Spirit (Peter said that "you will receive the gift," not the gifts of the Holy Spirit (Acts 2:38)? [One is a Person, the other is a talent. See my Advanced Bible Study on Spiritual Gifts, the lesson on The Difference Between the Gift, the Gifts, and the Baptism of the Holy Spirit.]

- 7. What does baptism have to do with starting a new life? When is our new life supposed to start in connection to baptism? Why is it supposed to start after baptism? What is this new life supposed to be like? [Romans 6:3, 4, 6; See my Bible Study on New Life, 'Walk in Newness of Life' Ro 6:4.]
- 8. Paul said, "Whoever will call on the name of the Lord will be saved" (Romans 10:13). How does one call on the name of the Lord to be saved? Is it to be done in prayer or in baptism? Is Paul teaching a different way to be saved than Peter and Jesus? Does calling on the name of the Lord to be saved have anything to do with water baptism?
- 9. When Paul himself believed in Jesus as Lord, how was he instructed to call on the name of the Lord to be saved? Was it in prayer or in water baptism? [Acts 22:16]
- 10. Whom did Jesus Christ instruct to call on the name of the Lord during a persons' baptism? How should a baptizer do this? [Matthew 28:18, 19]

Note: When I baptize someone, I stand in the water with him, and lift my right hand to God, and say, "I baptize you in the name of the Father, the Son (Jesus Christ), and the Holy Spirit for the forgiveness of your sins". Then I bury him in the water and quickly raise him up out of it to baptize him.

- 11. So when the first disciples went into all the nations with the gospel, how did they instruct the people to call upon the name of the Lord to be saved? Was it in prayer or was it in water baptism? [Book of Acts]
- 12. Is water baptism sprinkling, pouring, or dipping (immersion)? [Romans 6:4; Colossians 2:11, 12]
- 13. When were people being baptized? [Acts 8:12; 18:8]

- 14. Why is belief required before baptism? What is a person supposed to believe before he is baptized? How do you know he believes it? What is the good confession? ["The... unbelieving... their part will be in the the lake that burns with fire and brimstone" Rev 21:8; Acts 8:37, 38; Ro 10:9, 10]
- 15. What is the main purpose of preaching the gospel? [John 20:31]
- 16. Whom did Phillip the evangelist baptize? Were infants and children baptized in the New Testament? Why? Can infants believe? Who can truly understand the gospel? Is it an infant? Is it a child? Will God hold infants and children accountable for not being baptized? Why? [Acts 8:12]
- 17. Is water baptism a part of God's saving grace or not? Is it separate from the gospel of God's grace and simply a "work" or "work of the flesh" as some call it? Why? [1 Peter 5:12: 3:20, 21 "true grace" (1 pe 5:12) says "baptism now saves you" (1 Pe 3:21)]
- 18. Who is doing the work in a person's water baptism: the person being baptized, the baptizer, or Jesus Christ? ["by the circumcision of Christ" and "through faith in the working of God" Colossians 2:11, 12]
- 19. Why was the thief on the cross saved, and yet it seems he was not water baptized? At that time did anybody know how to be water baptized into Christ's death? Why? When was the command given for disciples to go and water baptize people in the name of the Lord? [Since Christ was not yet dead, buried, and raised from the dead (this is the gospel, the DBR SEE 1 Cor 15:3, 4), no one yet knew what the gospel was, including the thief. So

no one could yet preach the gospel, and therefore no one could respond top it by being water baptized into Christ's death, and raised up out of it with Him through faith. The command to water baptize the nations into Christ was given after Christ rose from the dead (Mt 28:6, 18, 19).]

20. Do we have to be baptized by God in the Holy Spirit and speak in tongues to be saved? Why? [See my Q&A on water baptism in this study and my Advanced Study on Spiritual Gifts.]

Are there any other fitting questions on the subject of being "baptized, and wash away your sins, calling on His name" (Ac 22:16)"?

Quiz on His Kindness

Lesson: We can be saved by continuing in God's grace, not His wrath!

Remind them to "Please answer with Scripture".

- 1. What was the very first religious lie which the Devil taught to people? [Genesis 3:4 "You surely will not die!"]
- 2. How did believing this false teaching about the nature of God and the meaning of His word affect Adam and Eve's opportunity to "live forever", meaning to have eternal life, or to eat of the "tree of life", meaning partake of eternal life? [Genesis 3:22-24]
- 3. Indeed, has God said there are any conditions to being saved? We know there are conditions to becoming saved, like believing (John 3:16). But are there any conditions to remaining saved, to having eternal life?
- 4. Jesus said that He gives eternal life to his sheep, that they will never perish (which is what eternal means, it's everlasting, it will last forever, in heaven that is, it never ends). He also said that no one can snatch sheep from God's hand (John 10:27-29).

Just like Noah was safe in the ark, believers are safe in God's hand. But does this mean that believers cannot jump ship or go overboard? Do you know the nature of sheep? Does this mean that believers cannot remove themselves from God's hand? Does this mean that God Himself will never take a believer out of His hand or throw him overboard? Are there any conditions to being saved?

- 5. Believers in Corinth were warned by Paul that there is a condition to remaining saved by the gospel. What is it? [1 Corinthians 15:1-4 "if [a condition] you [meaning believers] hold on to it"]
- 6. In the parable of the sower, what happened to the seed which was sown on the rocky ground? Did this person receive the gospel? Did this person hold on to the gospel? Did this person hold on to God's hand or did this person let it go? Did he jump ship? [Matthew 13:20, 21 "this man... receives it", the gospel]
- 7. Believers in Rome were warned by Paul that they needed to "continue in" something to receive God's kindness [His grace] and to avoid His severity [His wrath]. What was it? What did God say He will do to believers who do not "continue in" the gospel of His favor? [Romans 11:20-22]
- 8. In the parable of the sower, what happened to the seed which was sown on good soil? Did this person "continue in His kindness", the gospel of God's favor? Did this person hold on to the gospel? Did this person hold on to God's hand or did this person let it go? [Luke 8:15 "these... hold it fast... with perseverance (to continue in)"]
- 9. Which believers in Sardis did Jesus say would and would not have their names erased from the book of life by Him? Why? Who holds the eraser? [Revelations 3:5]
- 10. What is the book of life? What does it mean to have your name written in the book of eternal life? What does it mean that a name can be erased by the Lord from the book of eternal life? [Revelations 20:15]

- 11. In the Bible, when is the first time we learn that God will erase names from the book of life? Whose names would He erase? [Exodus 32:32, 33]
- 12. Peter said that it is better to be an unbeliever than a believer who does what? [2 Peter 2:20-22 "to turn away"]
- 13. The Jews were once saved but later lost. Why? What is unbelief? [Jude 1:5; Hebrews 3:18, 19]
- 14. Why did Paul want to check up on the faith of some believers he had made? Of what was he "afraid"? [1 Thessalonians 3:5]
- 15. So is it a matter of whether God can save a believer eternally or is it a matter of whether a believer repents of his sin and does not continue in it? [Isaiah 59:1, 2; Hebrews 10:26-29]

And so, it is a stimulating way for you to get a much needed discussion going on what our duties are after personal salvation.

I recommend that you yourself do not give any answers or Scriptures to the questions (I purposely did not list any). You will be covering the answers to them in the lessons, quizzes, and tests which follow it, and even in the other two studies in this Advanced Study on Christian Worship for Pleasing God (namely the Bible Study on True Worshipers, and the Bible Study on the Regulations of Divine Worship).

So, for this quiz, simply let your group answer the questions to see what they say or think on this subject. But of course, remind them to "Please answer with Scripture".

Alert! Before you start any level of study, and the discussion quizzes associated with it, we should remind everyone in the class about the dif-

ference between truth and opinion. Encourage everyone to speak the truth, not opinion. It may be wise for you to read the lesson on *The Difference between truth and opinion*, found on the back side of the test for the *Introduction to the Bible for Believers and Skeptics*, and at the beginning of the Level 1 discussion quizzes in this *Free Teacher Guide*.

Christians Are Like a Team

To get the discussion started about what it means to have a new life with Jesus Christ (Ro 6:4), let us compare ourselves to a sports team or a business team. This will help us to get a sense of the different key aspects related to it. Also, comparing Christians to a team will help us to more readily remember and apply the principles of this new life.

1. Teams have membership requirements. How does one become a member of Christ's team?

- 2. Teams have goals. What would be our team goal?
- 3. Teams have equipment. What kind of equipment (or tools) would we have?
- 4. Teams have coaches. Who would be our coaches (or managers) and what would they be like?
- 5. Teams have positions. What kind of positions (or jobs) would we have on our team?
- 6. Teams practice. What would our team practice (or work day) be like?
 7. Teams play in leagues. In what kind of league (or industry/market) would we play?
- 8. Teams wear uniforms. What kind of uniform (or business attire) would we wear?
- 9. Teams have a certain way of talking. What kind of chatter or talk would we use during the game (or work day) or in our team practice?
- 10. Would we have any special diet?
- 11. Teams have opponents. Who would be our opponent (or business competitors)?
- 12. How does one become a member of the opposing team (or business)?
- 13. What would be our opponents goal (or business goal)?
- 14. What kind of equipment (or business tools) would our opponent have?
- 15. Who would be our opponents coaches (or managers) and what

would they be like?

- 16. What kind of positions (or jobs) would our opponent have on their team?
- 17. What kind of team practice (or work day) would our opponent have?
- 18. In what kind of league (or market/industry) would our opponent play?
- 19. What kind of chatter or talk would our opponent use during the game (or work day) or team practice? 20. What kind of uniform (or business attire) would our opponent wear?
- 21. Would our opponent have any special diet?

Are there any other fitting questions on the subject of comparing God's people to a team?

Quiz on Membership

Lesson: How to Become a Member of God's Holy Team

Alert! If students cannot answer a quiz question in a fitting way, with Scripture, ask them to look up and read out loud the verses associated with it to find and give the answer themselves. Your goal is to let them answer from the Scripture, not you. Let them search the Scriptures, like the noble minded Bereans did (SEE Ac 17:11). Let them get knowledgeable and articulate in the word of God. For when you read the lessons, then you yourself will be giving a thorough answer or explanation and more!

Remind them to "Please answer with Scripture".

- 1. How does one become a member of a sports team or business team? Are there any basic or essential requirements which must be met, satisfied, and maintained in order for someone to be permitted to join a sports or business team and remain on it? Give examples from real life or from your own experiences in life. [Essentially, one must have the specific skills, talent, or abilities for which the team is looking or needs.]
- 2. How does one become a member of God's team (a member of Christ, a Christian)? Can a person be "born" Christian? Why or why not? [First, read them the question and see how they answer it. Then have them read out loud the following verses. Then, if need be, let them answer the question again. Do the same thing for the rest of the quiz questions. Jesus said, "You must be born again" (Jn 3:7). "Unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God" (Jn 3:3). "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless

one is **born** of water and the Spirit he cannot enter into the kingdom of God" (Jn 3:5). So to be able to "see" God's kingdom and to "enter into" God's kingdom (to recognize His team and to become a member of His team), at some fitting point after one is born naturally, he must also be born again according to the gospel or through the gospel of Jesus Christ. So one cannot be "born" Christian. To become one, "you must be born again". So to join the team, one's life must change in certain significant and meaninaful wavs.1

- What is there about the gospel that is just like being born again? [The answer to this question is in the following series of questions and answers.]
- 4. The Bible says one must "obey the gospel" to avoid "the penalty of eternal destruction" (2 Thess 1:8, 9). So first, what specifically is the gospel of Jesus Christ, and second, how is obeying it just like being "born again"? [The Gospel is the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ to a new life (1 Cor 15:1-5). So we should experience a death, burial, and resurrection to a new life (Ro 6:1-11).]
- 5. What is one supposed to die to? Has anyone of us not sinned? ["How shall we who **died to sin** still live in it?" (Ro 6:2); So one must die to his sins. "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Ro 3:23). So we all need to die to our sins, repent.]
- 6. Why did Jesus die for our sins on the cross? ["He Himself bore our sins in His body on the cross, so that we might die to sin and live to righteousness (1 Pe 2:24).]

- 7. How should one "die to sin and live to righteousness"? For example, how should an idolater die to his sin and live right, likewise the sexually immoral, thieves, swindlers, liars, magicians, revilers, the sensual, the promiscuous, the perverted, homosexuals, lesbians, fornicators, adulterers and adulteresses, those who aet intoxicated, cowards, murderers, etc.? [The answer to these questions were studied in my Complete Bible Study on the Basics for Beginners and Christians, specifically the lesson on repentance. In short, one must renounce these sins (put them aside) and start to live right.]
- 8. What does water baptism have to do with being "born again"? [It is how we are "buried" and "raised" with Jesus Christ. "We have been buried [B] with Him through baptism [B] into death [D], so that as Christ was raised [R] from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life" (Ro 6:4). So water baptism imitates Christ's burial and resurrection.]
- 9. When people believed in the gospel of Jesus Christ (as recorded in the Book of the Acts of the Apostles), why was their response to it just like being "born again"? [When people realized who Jesus was, they began to die to their sins, renouncing them, putting them aside, and they were buried with Jesus in water baptism, and they arose to begin to live the Christian life.]
- 10. Does God consider baptism a "work", and therefore He does not favor it or require it as one of the steps for being "born again", saved, or for membership in Christ? [Peter taught that baptism is a part of the true and saving grace of God (SEE 1 Pe 3:21; 5:12 "baptism now saves")

- you... This is the <u>true grace</u> [i.e. true favor] of God. Stand firm in it.").]
- 11. Why should one call upon the name of the Lord (Ro 10:13) in baptism to be saved, not in prayer? [Because in order for one to "obey the gospel", which is a Death, Burial, and Resurrection, not a Death **Prayer**, and Resurrection. should be buried with Jesus Christ in water baptism, not prayed with Him. Besides, it is how sinners were tauaht to call upon the name of the Lord to be saved. Jesus told teachers to do it that way (SEE Mt 28:19), and that is how Ananias told Paul to call upon the name of the Lord, in his baptism (SEE Ac 22:16).]
- 12. When one is "born again" by and through the gospel of Jesus Christ, he is born again to a "new... life" (Ro 6:4). What is this new life all about? [I have written this Bible Study on New Life to lead you to understand the correct answer to this question.]

Are there any other fitting questions on the subject of how one becomes a member of God's holy team?

Remind them to "Please answer with Scripture".

- 1. Why is our team goal to be holy? [1 Pe 1:16; 2 Tim 1:9; Ro 12:1]
- 2. What are some verses which tell us about God's holy nature? [His Spirit is called "Holy" or the "Holy Spirit" Mt 28:19; Isa 43:3; Rev 4:8]
- 3. How does Jesus make us holy? [Col 1:21, 22; 1 Cor 1:30 sanctification means holiness]
- 4. What will happen to us if we do not have as our goal to live a holy life? [He 12:14 sanctification means holiness]
- 5. In what "way" are we to first learn about Jesus Christ? [Eph 4:20-24 "learn Christ in this way... lay aside the old self.. and put on the new self, which in the likeness of God has been created in righteousness and holiness of the truth"; to learn the way of Christ is to learn the way of holiness, which is the way of God]
- 6. Why did Paul boldly minister the gospel to the Gentiles? [Ro 15:15, 16]
- 7. The Spirit of God is trying to save us through something. What is it? [2 Thess 2:13]
- 8. Why does our Father in Heaven discipline us? What does the word "discipline" mean? [He 12:10]
- 9. Our hearts must be established or founded in something by or before the second coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, What is it? [1 Thess 3:11-13

So not only our outward appearance, but also our inner heart must be established in holiness.]

10. Give some examples of holy men, women, or children from the Bible. Why or how were they holy? What was holy about them?

[John the Baptist, he even died for teaching against an unholy marriage union (Mk 6:20); Sarah (1 Peter 3:5, 6); David (a man after God's own heart, meaning desires, not his own desires (1 Sam 13:14); Samuel (he ministered to the Lord and was a holy prophet 1 Sam 2:18; 3:20; Jesus (He was the Christ and the Son of God from His inception through birth and adulthood Lk 1:31-33, and even as a boy he was amazing in His understanding of the things of the Lord Lk 2:47): Daniel (he did not defile himself with the kings food and would not bow down to idols)]

- 11. What does the words "holy" or "holiness" mean? [2 Cor 6:17 to "separate" from something in order to be pure and clean, holy, not unclean or defiled or unholy.]
- 12. Does your Christianity "separate" you from anything? If so, what?

Are there any other fitting questions on the subject of our holy goal?

Quiz on Our Opponent

Lesson: God's Team Has an Opponent of Holiness

Remind them to "Please answer with Scripture".

- 1. What does the word "Satan" mean? [Greek N.T. "Adversary; one who opposes another in purpose or act (eg. Mt 4:10). Hebrew O.T. "Adversary; one who withstands (eg. 1 Chron 21:1). "Your adversary [your Satan], the devil, prowls around" (1 Pe 5:8). "The accuser of our brethren,... he who accuses them before our God day and night" (Rev 12:10).]
- 2. How did Satan himself personally withstand, oppose, or act as an adversary to God, His word, or God's team or teammates? Give examples from both the Old and New Testaments. [O.T. Examples: Satan opposed God's word to Adam and Eve (Ge 3:1-6); He stood up against Israel (1 Chron 21:1); He accused the High Priest (Zech 3:1, 2; Related passage 2 Sam 24:1-25); He accused Job of serving God for only material things (Job 1:9-11); N.T. Examples: He tried to get Jesus to sin (Mt 4:3-11); Satan tried to oppose Jesus through Peter (Mt 16:23); He comes and takes away the word of God from those who hear it (Mk 4:15); He sought permission to destroy Peter (Lk 22:31-34); He hindered Paul from preaching the gospel to certain groups of people (1 Thess 2:18); He disputed with Michael over the body of Moses (Jude 9); Satan tried to destroy the Messiah and His mother from His birth (Rev 12:15).]
- 3. Satan is the father, the patriarch, the source, the originator, the author of what? [Jn 8:44]
- 4. What was the very first lie which Satan taught? What were the con-

sequences for speaking and believing this first lie? ["You surely will not die" (Ge 3:4); Yet, they surely died. God did not permit Adam and Eve to "live forever", meaning to have eternal life, or to eat of the "tree of life", meaning partake of eternal life (Genesis 3:22-24). He removed them from the garden of Eden. They surely died, physically. And also they did not receive eternal life. God would not permit them to stretch out their hands and eat of the tree of eternal life.]

Warning! There is a slithery double lie being perpetrated by the serpent and snakes just like him, that there is "nothing to do to be saved" and "nothing to do to be lost". These false assurances are typically taught at the same time. Yet we know once and for all that when sinners asked, "What must I do to be saved" (Acts 16:30) and "What shall we do [to be saved]" (Acts 2:37), they were told to do something, and it was not prayer [SEE Acts 2:37, 38; Acts 16:30-33].

- 5. What kind of "power" does Satan have or demonstrate? [Power to do false signs, wonders, miracles (2 Thess 2:9); Power over nature (Job 1:16); Power over health (Job 2:7; Lk 13:16); Power over the kingdoms of this world (1 Jn 5:19; Mt 4:8, 9); Power to blind minds (2 Cor 4:3, 4).]
- 6. Where is Satan's playing field? Where does he play his game? [The whole world (Re 12:7-9); The heart (Ac 5:3); The ministry (2 Cor 11:13-15).]
- 7. Which Scriptures reveal to us that Satan is a creature, not the Creator? ["which the Lord God had made" (Ge 3:1); only God, the Creator, is to be worshiped, not Satan (Mt 4:9, 10; Ro 1:25). Obviously, worshiping Satan would be the sin of idolatry, which by definition, means to worship and serve created things, like Satan, people, Mary the mother of Jesus, the sun, etc.]

Are there any other fitting questions on the subject of our unholy opponent?

Quiz on Our Equipment

Lesson: God's Team Is Equipped to Win Through Holiness

Remind them to "Please answer with Scripture".

- 1. Every team has some kind of equipment. What is our equipment?
- 2. What is the most important "piece" of equipment which God gives to each one of us? Why is this "piece" of equipment the most important One? [The Holy Spirit, He is "given" to us by God in our hearts "as a pledge" (Eph 1:13, 14); He is "greater" than our opponent, and ultimately, from within, helps us to "overcome" him and his workers (1 Jn 4:4).]
- 3. When does God give us or equip us with the Holy Spirit? [After we heard the gospel, believed it, and also obey it (SEE "given" Eph 1:13, 14; "gift of the Holy Spirit" Ac 2:38; "given to those who obey" Ac 5:32). Faith or belief in the aospel of Jesus Christ does not exclude obedience (SEE Ro 1:5: 16:26 about "the obedience of faith": faith obeys). And so to be given or equipped with the Holy Spirit, we must not only believe, but also, as Peter said in Acts 2:38, obey by repenting and being baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. God does not give His Spirit to disobedient and rebellious worshipers.]
- 4. Paul said that we should put on seven pieces of holy armor to defend ourselves against the attacks or temptations of our opponent. Name each piece of holy armor and explain the meaning of each one. [READ Eph 6:10-20]

(1) The Belt [truth]

What is the meaning of this piece of armor? Give examples of someone practicing the truth.

(2) The Breastplate [righteousness]

What is the meaning of this piece of armor? Give examples of someone practicing righteousness.

(3) Shod Feet [peace]

What is the meaning of this piece of armor? Give examples of someone practicing peace or peacemaking.

(4) The Shield [faith]

What is the meaning of this piece of armor? Give examples of someone practicing faith toward God.

(5) The Helmet [Salvation]

What is the meaning of this piece of armor? Give examples of somebody getting saved by the gospel.

(6) The Sword [Word of God]

What is the meaning of this piece of armor? Give examples of someone using the word of God to overcome evil, or to overcome Our opponent, or his teammates.

(7) Prayer

What is the meaning of this piece of armor? Give examples of someone practicing prayer.

5. God gave some of us certain spiritual gifts or talents for the "equipping of the saints [the holy ones]", especially for overcoming the false teachings of our opponent and his workers. Name these gifts? How

many of them are there? What do each one of them mean? How do each of these gifts equip us? [READ Eph 4:7-12]

(1) Apostles: What is the meaning of this gift or talent? How do they equip us?

[These have been specifically called by name by Jesus (that is Peter, John, the rest of the twelve and Paul) and blessed by Him to be in the teaching foundation on which all of us must be built (READ Eph 2:20). And so they equip us with the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Scriptures, since they wrote parts of it.]

(2) Prophets: What is the meaning of this gift or talent? How do they equip us?

[These also have been called and blessed by Jesus to be in the teaching foundation on which all of us must be built (Eph 2:20), for example, Jude, James (book of James), Luke (gospel according to Luke, Acts), etc. And so they also, like the apostles, equip us with the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Scriptures (and even the Old Testament), since they wrote significant parts of it.]

(3) Evangelists: What is the meaning of this gift or talent? How do they equip us?

[These have been called and blessed by Jesus to "Go" spread the gospel everywhere, in a geographical area, city, nation, or the world (For example, the apostles were also evangelists SEE Mt 28:19; Mk 16:15). And so evangelists equip us by spreading or announcing the word of God to all of us. They are heralds, announcers, etc.]

(4) Pastors: What is the meaning of this gift or talent? How do they equip us?

[These have been called and blessed by Jesus to shepherd one local flock of Christians, for the word Pastor means shepherd (Ac 20:17, 28; 1 Peter 5:1, 2). And so they equip us like a shepherd; they organize us for worship, they care for our needs, they protect us as sheep, they feed us on the pure word of God, etc.]

(5) Teachers: What is the meaning of this gift or talent? How do they equip us?

[These have been called and blessed by Jesus to impart the basic and advanced word of Christ to others, yet without having a pastorate, if you will, or an apostleship, or without being a prophet, without evangelizing a city (Ro 2:18-20 is an example of what a teacher should be able to teach).]

Note: For a detailed study on each one of these gifts (including Self-Tests for each gift), see The Bible Study on the Greater Gifts, "Earnestly Desire the Greater Gifts" (1 Cor 12:31).

Are there any other fitting questions on the subject of our holy equipment?

Quiz on Our Team Practice

Lesson: God's Team Should Practice Together to Strengthen One Another in Holiness

Remind them to "Please answer with Scripture".

- 1. Teams in this world are in the habit of practicing together to be victorious, to be successful, to reach their goal, to win! Should God's team be in the habit of practicing together to be successful, to reach their goal, to win? How so? [Hebrews 10:25 teaches us to habitually go to church (assembly) to encourage one another. "Encourage" here means to strengthen, and for the purpose of this study, to strengthen one another in holiness, which is our team goal.]
- 2. What happens to a member of a sports team or business team who has a habit of missing "practice" or showing up late? [He gets disciplined, replaced, or dismissed from the team.]
- 3. What will happen to members of God's team who are in the habit of missing "practice"? [It can lead to: "destruction" (He 10:39), which is a consequence related to shrinking back from our good confession of Christ, including attending the assembly, meaning church, in this case "practice" (READ He 10:23-39); In the old covenant, people who forsook the "holy convocation" (Lev 23:3 meaning the assembly/church) would be "cut off" (Ex 31:14,15). And so, in both the old and new covenants with God, we can see that it is a very serious sin to be in the habit of missing team practice.1

- 4. How often do sports teams or business teams practice together, especially when they get near the start of their official season? Give examples of this. [A lot! Even daily, especially before their season starts.]
- 5. How often should God's team practice together? Give examples of this from the Scriptures. [A lot! "All the more as you see the day drawing near" (He 10:25), not all the less, especially as we see the day of Christ drawing near; "day by day" (Ac 2:46). "On the first day of the week" (Ac 20:7), meaning weekly on Sunday, the day our Lord rose from the dead. In the Old Covenant, it was supposed to be weekly during every Sabbath (Lev 23:3) a "holy convocation", meaning a holy meeting. Our meetings are supposed to be "holy". Amen.]
- 6. Who leads sports and business teams? Who should lead God's team? [SEE The Bible Study on the Greater Gifts, "Earnestly Desire the Greater Gifts" 1 Cor 12:31]
- 7. What are some of the positions that people play on certain sports teams or business teams? What are all of the many positions to play on God's team? [SEE The Complete Bible Study on Spiritual Gifts to Cause Christian Church Growth, which includes The Bible Study on the Greater Gifts, The Bible Study on the Non-Teaching Gifts, and The Bible Study on the Study on th
- 8. Do sports teams or business teams have back up players and why? Does God's team need backup players and why? [Backup players are needed to help any team continue to play the game when certain members are injured, sick, retire, or pass on to their reward, etc.]

- 9. During practice, teams do several things in order to strengthen all of their skills or talents. For example, soccer teams practice running, kicking goals, defensive moves, etc. Name some things other sports teams and business teams do to strengthen all of their skills for playing and winning their game.
- 10. What should God's team do during practice to strengthen or increase all of the skills which they will need in order to be victorious, to win the game? [SEE The Complete Bible Study on Christian Worship for Pleasing God (which includes this study, and The Bible Study on True Worshipers, and The Bible Study on the Divine Regulations of Christian Worship), and also see the Complete Bible Study on Spiritual Gifts]
- 11. When sports teams or business teams practice, what are some of the policies, regulations, or rules that they aim to follow or obey? Give several examples from real life.
- 12. Are there any policies, regulations, or rules God's team should aim to follow or obey during practice? [SEE The Complete Bible Study on Christian Worship for Pleasing God (which includes this study, and The Bible Study on True Worshipers, and The Bible Study on the Divine Regulations of Christian Worship), and also see the Complete Bible Study on Spiritual Gifts]
- 13. Are there any examples in the Bible of God's team coming together to "practice" in a sinful, unholy way, to strengthen one another in sin? How so? [The Old Covenant: There are many, many examples of how Israel assembled, churched, or worshiped together in an unholy way, in sin. For example,

after Israel was saved by the Lord from Egypt, they assembled to worship an idol (Ex 32). During the time of the Judges, it seems that Israel worshiped Gideon's ephod and then Baal (Judaes 8:27, 33, 34). Durina the time of the kings of Israel, one man, Jeroboam, led astrav 10 tribes of Israel (80% of the kinadom of God) to worship a golden calf (1 Kinas 11:31: 12:28). And so on and so forth. The New Covenant: Simply consider the church in Corinth. First, they began to divide or separate themselves into different parties based on the names of their favorite religious men (1 Cor 1:12, 13: More about this sin in The Bible Study on True Worshipers). Second. they were proud to have members of their church who were sexually immoral (1 Cor 5). Third, they could not properly judge the sins which they committed against one another, and so they took them to the assembly/court of the Gentiles to get them resolved (1 Cor 6). And so on and so fourth. They even sinned during the Lord's Supper by getting intoxicated and behaving in a gluttonous and selfish way. And because of this, Paul said, "you come together not for the better but for the worse" (1 Cor 11:17). At the church in Thyatira, a woman named Jezebel strenathened members to commit sexual immorality and idolatry (Rev 2:20). So it is no surprise at all that God's team has a history of impurity in and amona the membership. Many Christians, and churches, have very serious purity [holiness] problems. Yet we must strive to practice together in holiness. We must strive to have only holy members.1

14. Teams in this world recruit, search for, and employ certain kinds of talented players or mem-

bers to add to their ability to be victorious, to reach their goal, to be successful, to win. Give some examples of how sports teams and business teams do this.

- 15. How should God's holy team find or recruit new members to add to their ability to be victorious, to reach their goal, to win? [We should preach the holy gospel to others (Mt 28:18, 19; Mk 16:15, 16). But we must remember to help others "learn Christ in this way... in holiness of the truth" (Eph 4:20-24). So to learn the way of Christ is to learn the way of holiness. God is looking for new members for His team, yet they must be holy members, not unholy ones. God's team goal is holiness.]
- 16. When you come to practice, how do you yourself strengthen others in holiness? How do you help others reach the team goal? How should you help others be strong in holiness? [This entire 3-Level Bible study curriculum was written to help you know how to strengthen others in holiness, especially yourself! Now make sure that you come to practice with your holy equipment, including your Bible! And as you learn more and more about holiness, bring more and more of it with you to practice. Amen.]

Are there any other fitting questions on the subject of holy team practice?

Quiz on Our League

Lesson: God's Team Must Stay in the League of Holiness

Remind them to "Please answer with Scripture".

- 1. Sports teams play in leagues. What is the meaning and the purpose of a league? Give some examples of different kinds of leagues in which sports team play or participate.
- 2. What does it mean to play in the league of holiness? [It means to "be separate" (vs. 17), that is holy, especially, as God pointed out, in regards to the kind of relationships we enter into and maintain (SEE 2 Cor 6:14 through chapter 7:1).]
- 3. What did God mean when He said that we should be "perfecting holiness" (2 Cor 7:1)? What does "perfecting" mean? What does "holiness" mean? [He meant that we should be maturing (perfecting) our separation (holiness) from something.]
- 4. What two promises did God make to us who would be "perfecting holiness"? In other words, why should we be "maturing separation" from something; for what two reasons? [Because, if we do so, God then promised to (1) "welcome" us, and (2) be a "Father" to us; He will consider us His "sons" and "daughters" (2 Cor 6:17, 18). Indeed, if we fail to do so He will not welcome us, but instead ignore us. He will not consider us His children.]
- 5. How should we be "perfecting holiness"? How did God instruct us to do so? [Many of the answers to this question are in the passage which teaches us to be "perfecting holiness" (2 Cor 6:14 through

- chapter 7:1), such as (a) "do not be bound together with unbelievers", (b) "come out from their midst", (c) "be separate [holy]", (d) "do not touch what is unclean", (e) "cleanse ourselves from all defilement of flesh and spirit", (f) "in the fear of God".]
- 6. When God said, "do not be bound together with unbelievers" (2 Cor 6:14), what did He mean by that? What does the word "bound" mean? [He meant that Christians should not get into certain binding agreements with non-Christians. A binding agreement is one in which we cannot or should not unbind; hence bound, that is, bound by the law of God or man. To be "bound" means to be intertwined or fastened together by something, like the pages of a book being bound together: they are in the same book and cannot or should not be separated.]
- 7. Give some examples of binding gareements between people, meaning agreements which we either cannot or should not unbind. [Slavery is a binding agreement (being slavebound), for you are not free. Holy marriage is a binding agreement (being marriage-bound), for you are becoming one in the flesh. Soldiering is a binding agreement (being warbound), for you have to kill whom they tell you to kill. Certain work agreements are binding (being workbound), for you could be committing yourself to work in such a way which violates the will of God. Etc.]
- 8. Should we bind ourselves in slavery? Why? ["Do not become slaves of men" (1 Cor 7:23)]
- 9. Should we bind ourselves in war? Why? [2 Cor 10:4]

- 10. Should we bind ourselves in marriage to unbelievers? Why? ["Only in the Lord" (1 Cor 7:39), meaning in the Lord Jesus Christ, a Christian.]
- 11. Should we bind ourselves in work agreements which violate the will of God? Why? ["What partner-ship have righteousness and law-lessness?" (1 Cor 6:14)]
- 12. Should we agree to work during assembly times? Why? [He 10:25; Why let unbelievers force us into the habit of working during holy church?]
- 13. Should we live with someone before we marry them? Why? [Jn 4:17, 18; It is sexual immorality; It appears evil (1 Thess 5:22 KJV).]
- 14. Should we live with someone of the opposite sex to share expenses? Why? [It appears that both of you are married to each other, and yet you are not! And we are to avoid all "appearance" of evil (1 Thess 5:22 KJV). Sexual immorality is evil, and even what appears to be immoral, is evil.]
- 15. What should we do if we find ourselves in an unholy situation, relationship, or agreement? [" 'Come out from their midst and be separate' says the Lord" (2 Cor 6:17)]
- 16. Why is the man in Psalm 1 blessed of God? [He separates himself from scoffers, sinners, and wicked people (vs 1), and instead he devotes himself to the holy word of God (vs. 2).]
- 17. Is it possible to live with God someday in heaven if we enjoy, honor, or esteem sinful men? Why? [To dwell with God someday on His "holy hill" (vs. 1) one must despise (vs 4), not enjoy a "reprobate", meaning one whom God rejects; a reject (Ps 15:1-5).]

- 18. Should we keep company with foolish people? Why? [Prov 14:7; 15:7]
- 19. With whom then should we keep company? Who should we have or select as our friends? [Ps 119:63; Wise people fear God and keep His commandments. Consider Abraham, he feared God and diligently kept His commandments. For example, God said to Abraham, "I know that you fear God, since you have not withheld your son, your only son, from Me" (Ge 22:12). Yet Abraham could see when certain people did not fear God or keep His commandments. For example, Abraham said, "There is no fear of God in this place (Ge 20:11). So Abraham is an excellent and wise example of a good companion, yet those in the land in which he was travelina were not!1

Are there any other fitting questions on the subject of the holy league in which we are to play?

Quiz on Our Uniform

Lesson: God's Team Must Wear Holy Uniforms

Remind them to "Please answer with Scripture".

- 1. Why do sports teams wear uniforms? [There are at least four reasons for this. First, when you join a team, you are issued or given a uniform to wear, since wearing it is a requirement of being on the team, of playing in the league. Two, wearing it shows to which team you belong; it shows your membership; it identifies you as a member of a certain team. Third, it distinguishes you from the other teams and their uniforms; it shows that you are different. Forth, it could also equip you for your particular activity or sport.]
- 2. When you join God's team, what "uniform" are you issued or given to wear? Why is wearing Christ a requirement of being on God's team? How should wearing Christ reveal or show to others to whom one belongs? How should wearing Christ make one look different than the people on the other team? How can wearing Christ equip one to play in the league of holiness? ["For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ" (Ga 3:27). So when someone joins God's team, he is clothed with the uniform of Christ. The answer to the rest of the auestions is what this Bible Study on New Life is all about.]
- 3. At the marriage ceremony of Jesus Christ and His bride, "the saints", the separated ones, what kind of wedding dress is Christ expecting to see on His bride (she should have "made" a special style of dress for that big day)? Why is righteousness so very, very important to the Bridegroom? [Re 19:7, 8; 1 Cor 6:9; 1 Jn 2:29; 3:7]

- 4. Give some examples of how certain people "wore" righteousness in the Bible. What were their names and what did they do that was considered a righteous act? [Ro 5:18; Ge 15:6; Ac 9:36]
- 5. Why does God especially "want" the female members of His team to wear the uniform of "good works"? What are good works? [1 Tim 2:9, 10; Because God said that "good works" are the "proper" (vs. 10) way for godly women to "adorn" themselves (as opposed to devoting themselves to the improper adornment of immodest and indiscreet clothing, fancy hair do's, jewelry, and expensive garments, and the like). Good works are choice, excellent deeds.]
- 6. God wants female team members to clothe themselves "modestly and discreetly (1 Tim 2:9). What do the words "modestly and discreetly" mean? [To be adorned "modestly" means to clothe oneself with a sense of shame (the keyword is shame), shamefacedness; bashfulness towards others, covering up; not clothed in a senseless, unashamed way; shameless, bold, brazen, with no shame, etc. To be adorned "discreetly" means to be hidden (the keyword is hidden), to not reveal oneself to others in various ways with one's clothing.]
- 7. God does "not" want female team members to adorn themselves with "braided hair" (1 Tim 2:9)? What is "braided hair"? [It is a fancy, not simplistic, hair arrangement that is woven or interwoven or one in which things are added to the hair, such as braids, beads, etc. Fancy hair do's or arrangements are no replacement for "good works". God wants women to be devoted to good works, not their hair or fashion.]

- 8. God does "not" want female team members to adorn themselves with "gold or pearls" (1 Tim 2:9). What are "gold and pearls"? [They are forms of jewelry. Jewelry is no replacement for "good works".]
- 9. God does "not" want the female members of His team to wear "costly garments" (1 Tim 2:9). What are "costly garments"? [They are expensive. Expensive clothes are no replacement for "good works".]
- 10. God does "not" want female team members to be "putting on dresses" (1 Pet 3:3). What does it mean to be "putting on dresses"? [It means to be in the habit of havina a lot of clothes, a lot of costumes. a lot of fashion, etc. The costumed lifestyle is no replacement for "good works". So, for the occasion at hand, why not instead be thinking about "putting on good works", not another kind of dress, or anything else that God prohibits? God is impressed with "good works", not the latest fashion, a fancy hair do, expensive clothes, or jewelry, and things of that nature.]
- 11. Why should members of God's team wear gender specific uniforms? [Deut 22:5; "Abominable" people will not be saved (Re 21:8).]
- 12. Why should the male members of God's team have short hair and the female members of God's team have long hair? [1 Cor 11:14, 15; It is the natural order of creation.]
- 13. Why is it a sin to encourage God's girls to be boys (Tom-Boys) and God's boys to be girls ("Sissy-Girls")? [It is effeminate and emasculate, both of which are condemned by God (1 Cor 6:9).]

- 14. Why should a male member of God's team <u>not</u> "cover" his head during worship? [To show respect and honor, not disgrace or dishonor, towards "his head" (vs. 4), meaning his authority, who is Christ (1 Cor 11:3, 4). "Christ is <u>the head</u> of man" (vs. 3).]
- 15. Why should a female member of God's team "cover" her head during worship? [To show respect and honor, not disgrace or dishonor, towards "her head", meaning her authority, who is man (1 Cor 11:3, 5). "Man is the head of a woman" (vs. 3).]
- 16. What does the word "cover" (1 Cor 11:6) mean in regards to one's head? [Literally it means "to have something down the head; to veil oneself" [Vines Expository Dictionary of Old and New Testament Words]; to have something on one's head, or as the Scripture says, "on his head" (vs. 4). Hence, a head covering or as the Scripture says, "head covered" (vs. 7).]

Quiz on Our Language

Lesson: God's Team Must Talk Holy

ALERT! Before starting this quiz, please read all of this "Alert" to your group to prepare them to control their tongues during this quiz.

When one studies or teaches the difference between holy and unholy language, he himself will be tempted to use foul or profane speech. Beware, Satan will try to use this lesson to tempt the one who studies it and the one who teaches it to speak, state, or give examples of profane language, either in a very direct or indirect, subtle way, and therefore sin while doing so.

For example, to show others how <u>not</u> to take the name of the Lord in vain, teachers will be tempted to take the name of the Lord in vain, use foul or profane language, or use evil words to show others how not to do so (my own ears have heard so called "senior" pastors do this while teaching or conversing freely on the subject!).

Likewise, the one who studies this lesson will be tempted to ask questions, make statements, or comments which contain foul language or improper uses of the name of the Lord. It's better for students not to say anything during this lesson. It will be hard enough for a teacher to shed light on this subject without sinning himself! Pray for teachers! In my experience, I know of only one man, one of my teachers, who taught me about this subject without sinning in his speech. When I saw him decades later, I praised him for it, since I realize now how hard it is do so when I teach others. So in your teaching, or in your answers, do not use any foul word, and do not take the name of the Lord in vain, in any way, shape, or form. This is not a time to sin in your speech to show others your knowledge of what words are sinful. One must not murder to show others what murder is. Likewise, one must not speak foul or vain words or sayings to show others what is vain or foul speech. If you do so, repent quickly and openly before the group.

Likewise, there is no liberty to be silly or amused. Some will be tempted to be silly with this topic or think it is good for a few laughs. But it should be taught soberly, with all seriousness. Sinful speech is no laughing matter; it is not a subject for amusement. During this lesson, extinguish or suppress any foolhardiness and desire to be amused or entertained, or any desire to be the entertainer-in-chief.

Note: At one time, while teaching this subject to a certain group, I myself took the name of the Lord in vain by mistake, even though I had no intention of doing so! I was not cursing. I was teaching. And at a certain place in this lesson, while teaching on this subject, I filled in too many blanks so to speak, and to my amazement, out it came! And so before the group, while rasing my hand to heaven, I quickly and openly asked God to forgive me for this serious sin and I apologized to the group for speaking vainly. The study of this subject can so easily trip up anyone of us. Beware. Again beware. Control your tongue, especially in regards to the name of God.

[Now the men in our family grew up taking the name of the Lord in vain and using other foul language every day. My mother use to say to us children, "If I had a nickle for every time he [my father] took the name of the Lord in vain, I would be rich". And so you can see why teaching against this sin in a most careful way is so very important to me. It is because I used to commit it all the time. But thanks be to God, through Jesus Christ, His grace has helped me to overcome the habit of it. My father was so very foul in this way that it has taken me years to erase his vain voice from the tape recorder of my mind. My mind was preconditioned by him, really Satan, to constantly take God's name in vain over any issue that presented itself to me in life. And so you can see why I have been called to teach very carefully, thoroughly, and soberly on this subject. I have a lot to prove in repenting of these sins of my youth.]

Remind them to "Please answer with Scripture".

- 1. The grace of God is supposed to "enrich" all of our speech (1 Cor 1:4, 5). What does the word "enrich" mean? [Simply, it's the opposite of being impoverished or poor in speech. To make wealthy, I was very poor in speech!]
- 2. A Christian is not supposed to let any "unwholesome word" proceed out of his mouth (Eph 4:29). What does the word "unwholesome" mean? [Simply put, it means bad words, not good words.]
- 3. If a Christian speaks, he is supposed to speak "according to the need" (Eph 4:29) of the hearers, in a way that builds them up toward God. What are some examples of the different kinds of needs that people have, like children? What would be fitting to say for each need? There are people who are sick. What do they need to hear? What about the needs of your parents, your husband, your wife, your leaders, those who grieve, the needs of the lost, the needs of the saved, the downcast, the happy, those who reioice, those who weep and mourn, those who are persecuted for righteousness sake, etc. What do these kinds of people need to hear?

Note: I keep a piece of paper in my pocket that says, "SPEAK TO NEED OF HEARERS". When I put my hand in my pocket and touch that paper, or every time I pull it out to look at it, this helps prepare me to say fitting things to my wife, my children, my Bible study students, community members, etc. It helps me to control my tongue a little more. It reminds me to speak to people's needs, to not be silly, etc.

4. God said that His people must not misuse His name (in a vain, meaning useless way, or foul or profane way) or else He would punish them for doing so (Ex 20:7). To make sure that we do not misuse any of His names, besides the name "God", what other names does God use for Himself? [Lord, Christ, Jesus, Father, etc.]

- 5. At one time, Moses did not sanctify, that is treat God's name as holy, before the people (Lev 22:32), and thereby profaned it or "misused it". Because of this, God punished Moses by not letting him enter the Promised Land (Nu 20:12). What did Moses actually say or not say that caused this to happen? [Ps 106:32, 33; "Shall we bring forth water for you out of this rock?" (Nu 20:10). He did not credit God for this before the people. So Moses profaned the name of the Lord by simply not giving God the credit for the water.]
- 6. The Lord said that you shall not curse God or the ruler of your people (Ex 22:28). Who is the ruler of your people? Why is it wrong to curse God or rulers of people? [To curse means to blaspheme, to speak evil of, or to revile. And as pointed out in the Bible Study on the Basics for Beginners and Christians, "revilers" (1 Cor 6:10), those who are in the habit of speaking evil of others, cursing them, bad mouthing them, will not be saved.]
- 7. Why did Jesus charge certain Jews with an eternal sin, of blaspheming or reviling the good Holy Spirit? How were they blaspheming the Holy Spirit. [Because they said that Jesus was doing a good work (casting out demons) by the power of the ruler of the demons, Satan, and therefore Jesus had an unclean spirit inside of Him, a demon (Mk 3:22-30). So they essentially called the good Spirit of God, who was doing these good works, a demon and the Devil. Rightly Jesus said to them about this subject, "You brood of vipers, how can you, being evil, speak what is good?" (Mt 12:34)]
- 8. Why is it improper to even speak of the things which the disobedient do? [Because "it is disgraceful" (Eph 5:11, 12). So it is simply not the graceful thing to do. We should not be the Devil's reporter so to speak.]

- 9. Is it proper to be foul mouthed? Why? ["There must be no filthiness... not fitting" (Eph 5:4)]
- 10. Is it proper to be silly? Why? ["There must be <u>no</u> filthiness and <u>silly talk... not fitting</u>" (Eph 5:4)]
- 11. Is it proper to be a crude or vulgar comedian? Why? ["There must be no filthiness and silly talk, or coarse jesting, which are not fitting" (Eph 5:4)]
- 12. Why is it necessary to use firm discipline to remove foolishness from a child? ["Because foolishness is bound up in the heart of a child" (Pr 22:16). So they are bound together, like an intimate partnership or close friendship. They must be separated for good!]
- 13. Does foolish talk make a person successful? What is about to happen to a person with a foolish mouth? ["ruin is at hand" Pr 10:14]
- 14. A very little of what ingredient or substance will outweigh the very heavy weights of one's wisdom and honor? [Eccl 10:1; Now foolishness also means silliness. So don't be silly.]
- 15. What sin is so defiling to oneself that Jesus listed or grouped it along with the sins of evil thoughts, fornications, thefts, murders, adulteries, deeds of coveting and wickedness, as well as deceit, sensuality, envy, slander, and pride? ["foolishness" (Mk 7:21-23)]
- 16. Leaders of a church must not be silly men, but instead be what kind of men. ["grave" or "dignified" (1 Tim 3:4), which mean serious and sober]
- 17. Why should we be sober minded and serious ? [1 Pe 4:7; 5:8; 1 Cor 15:34]
- 18. People who speak for God, like Paul did, are to do so in what man-


ner? ["solemnly" Ac 20:24; "utter words of sober truth" (Ac 26:25)]

- 19. What does the Scripture say is just like "good medicine"? What is the difference between "joy" and comedic laughter. joking, or silliness? ["A joyful heart is good medicine" (Pr 17:22), not a silly or comedic heart. Joy [meaning gladness of heart] is a fruit of the Holy Spirit (Ga 5:22), not comedianism, joking, or silliness, and the like. The fruit of the Holy Spirit is truly the nature of God. God is not silly, a jester: He does not play the fool, etc. Likewise, Jesus was not silly, and so on and so forth. He was not that kind of person to be around; some slap happy yuckster, always snickering and gigaling at everything that tickled His funnybone (a.k.a. foolish bone). He did not entertain anyone in that way. Yet God does have the fruit of the Spirit; He has joy. For example, Jesus rejoiced over what God was doing among His disciples (Lk 10:21).]
- 20. How has God brought joy and gladness to the world. His people, the angels, children, etc? Give examples from the Bible which indicate or illustrate gladness and joy. How should one bring joy to God, His people, and the world? [Consider the song "Joy to the world, the Lord has come," or the verse, "I bring you good news of great joy." Consider the children who were joyously shouting "hosanna in the highest," it was a time of great joy. Consider Elizabeth's baby, John, leaping in the womb for joy over the name of Jesus Christ. Think about Mary, when she rejoiced over what God had done for her, saying the Mighty One has done great things for me. What happens among the angels when one sinner renounces his sin and lives right? Consider the story of the woman who lost one coin and then found it again. She rejoiced! Etc.]

Lesson: What Is The Right Way to Worship God?

Alert! Prepare the group for this quiz (and for this *Bible Study on True Worshipers*) by having them first read out loud to each other John 4:1-42. For all of today's quiz questions relate to the story of the woman at the well. So, when this quiz starts, also alert the group to find or base their answers on that passage.

Alert! If students cannot answer a quiz question in a fitting way, with Scripture, ask them to look up and read out loud the verses associated with it to find and give the answer themselves. Your goal is to let them answer from the Scripture, not you. Let them search the Scriptures, like the noble minded Bereans did (SEE Ac 17:11). Let them get knowledgeable and articulate in the word of God. For when you read the lessons, then you yourself will be giving a thorough answer or explanation and more!

Remind them to "Please answer with Scripture".

1. When the woman at the well realized that Jesus was a holy proph-

- et, what disputed and confusing subject did she immediately bring up to Him? [First, read them the question and see how they answer it. Then have them read out loud Jn 4:19, 20. Then, if need be, let them answer the question again. Do the same thing for the rest of the quiz questions.]
- 2. "Where" did Jesus say is the right place to worship God? [Jn 4:21]
- 3. If it is no longer a question of "where" men ought to worship the Lord, then how should men worship God from now on? [Jn 4:23; It's no longer a question of "where" men ought to worship God, but "how" men ought to worship Him.]
- 4. What does it mean to worship God "in spirit and truth"? Who's spirit and who's truth is it taking about here? What is the spirit? What is the truth? [Ro 1:4; 2 Cor 13:14; Jn 17:17; Eph 4:24; "the Spirit of holiness," "the Holy Spirit," "Your word is truth," "holiness of the truth"]
- 5. Does God "seek" every form, style, or kind of worship or group of worshipers? Why or why not? [Jn 4:23; "seeks"]

- 6. Why does Jesus require us to worship God in a spiritual and truthful manner? [Jn 4:24; "must worship"; Because it is the very nature and character of our God. He is spiritual and truthful, not sensual and erring. Therefore, He cannot accept any kind or element of worship which is offered to Him by men that is not in keeping with His character.]
- 7. Whom did Jesus say we should worship? Is there any significance to this? [Jn 4:21; "the Father"; Refer to the Lesson "Worship the Father, Not a Genderless Being"]
- 8. Why should the Jews have known God, and how to worship Him, and not the Samaritans or the Gentiles? [Jn 4:22]
- 9. It is understood that the Messiah would tell us all things about God, even worship. How then did the woman at the well indicate her belief in this? [Jn 4:25, 26; Jn 6:68]

Are there any other fitting and proper questions, from the passage of the woman at the well, on how men ought to worship God?

Quiz on Vocabulary

Lesson: A Very Important Vocabulary Lesson for Christians

Remind them to "Please answer with Scripture".

- 1. Use the Scriptures to find, establish, and define the teachings of Non-Denominationalism. Be "more noble-minded" than some worshipers, and instead be like the Bereans, who, "with great eagerness," were "examining the Scriptures daily to see whether these things were so" (Ac 17:11). Is Non-Denominationalism so? As a commandment and teaching of the Lord Jesus Christ or His holy apostles and prophets, does it exist in the Scriptures?
- 2. Use the Scriptures to find, establish, and define the teachings of what is called "Traditional" worship.
- 3. Use the Scriptures to find, establish, and define the teachings of Denominationalism.
- 4. Use the Scriptures to find, establish, and define the teachings of Contemporary Worship.
- 5. Use the Scriptures to find, establish, and define the teachings of Acappella.
- 6. Use the Scriptures to find, establish, and define the teachings of the Rapture.
- 7. Use the Scriptures to find, establish, and define the teaching of Legalism.
- 8. Why is it difficult to find, establish, and define the exact meaning of these words, and others like them, with the Scriptures? [1 Cor 4:6; They "exceed what is written," meaning they go beyond a fixed limit, they

- were not inspired or commanded by God, they were not God-breathed (for we cannot find these words in the Bible or a Bible concordance). And, as such, they lead to arrogance and divisiveness among worshipers, which is what 1 Corinthians 4:6 says happens when we exceed what is written. Therefore we cannot establish these words as a doctrine or teaching from God, and therefore we cannot accurately define them.]
- 9. Are these words (Denominationalism, Non-Denominationalism, Contemporary, Acappella, Legalism, etc.) considered the truth or an opinion? What is the difference between truth and opinion? [Refer to lesson "Uphold the Truth, Not Opinions!" in the chapter "Worship in Truth, Not Error!"]
- 10. What is the "sword of the Spirit"? Is it the word [the vocabulary] of men? [Eph 6:17]
- 11. Do these "man-made" words help us to satisfy the requirement to "worship in spirit and truth" (Jn 4:24)? Why or why not? Are they the truth? Are they of the Spirit, the Holy Spirit? Were they given to us by God, through the Spirit, to guide us in the truth, to practice the truth?
- 12. It does not matter if we worship God in Traditional or Contemporary (denominational or nondenominational, etc.), as long as we worship in spirit and truth. Is this true? Why or why not? [How can these forms of worship be "in spirit and truth," meaning according to the spirit and truth of God, if they do not exist in the Bible, if they were not commanded by the Lord?]
- 13. Did God say He seeks Traditional or Contemporary worshipers,

denominational or non-denominational worshipers? [No! For the kind or style of worshipers He seeks, read Jn 4:23]

14. Does the way that a church characterizes, names, or frames their worship affect the content and character (the nature) of their worship? How so? For example, how does the word "Contemporary" affect the content and nature or character of an assembly's worship? What does the word "Contemporary" really mean? Do Contemporary worshipers like to do things that they consider "outdated" or not according to their current culture? What would Contemporary Worshipers think of the song, "Give me that old time religion"? Do they like things that seem old or new? Ilet us be careful how we frame or "name" our worship, since it will affect the content and character of what we offer to God. Let us use God's words, not man's, to frame our worship so that we can then have a chance to properly paint the picture that He wants to see in the frame, meaning in us. Amen.]

Warning! Let us be careful to hear, practice, and teach the words of God, not men, especially about how to worship God, what we offer to God (READ Lk 8:18; 11:28; Jn 8:47; 14:24).

Are there any other fitting and proper questions about the worship vocabulary of God vs. the worship vocabulary of men?

- 3. Why did God reject Cain and his worship/offering? [Ge 4:3-7; He 11:4; Did he give God the very best of the first fruits of the ground? Did he do well?]
- 4. Why did God reject Esau? [Ge 25:34; He 12:15-17; Ro 9:13]
- 5. Why did God reject all of the adult Jews who came out of Egypt, except Caleb and Joshua? [Nu 32:12]
- 6. Why did God reject two priests, Nadab and Abihu? [Le 10:1, 2]
- 7. Why did God reject one of His prophets, Balaam? [Num 31:16; Josh 13:22]

24. Why must we be filled with "all spiritual wisdom," not sensual wisdom, regarding the will of God and the worship of Him? [Colossians 1:9-12: Ro 8:13, 14: To walk worthy of the Lord, to bear fruit, to please God in all things, etc. To put to death the misdeeds of the flesh, which is what it means to be led by the Spirit of God (not as some say or act define it like the lord is telling them to say this or that, or do this or that, depending on the dynamics of a situation. Worshipers who are truly correcting themselves, through repentance, are being led by the Spirit of God. God wants us to mainly repent, not say He is telling me to do this or that, making it sound like God is speaking to a person audibly. 1

25. Why is it important to continually study the differences between true and false worshipers? [Philippians 4:8; "Whatever is true... dwell on these things" . As Christians, we are supposed to dwell on the truth, so that we can obviously be enlightened by it and put it into practice. For Jesus said, "Blessed are those who hear the word of God and observe it" (Lk 11:28).]

Quiz on What Our Worship Is Centered

Lesson: Focus on a Person [A Name], Not a Place

Remind them to "Please answer with Scripture".

- 1. "Where" should men worship God? [Jn 4:20, 21, 23; It's not anymore about "where" we worship, like Jerusalem or on that mountain in Samaria, but "how" we worship (in spirit and truth) and also "through" whom we worship, namely Jesus Christ, and "whom" we worship, namely the Father, etc.]
- 2. Mosaic worship centered on what location and place? [Jerusalem; The Temple; Ps 122:1-4; 2 Kings 18:22; Deut 16:16;]
- 3. What did King Solomon emphasize over and over again in his prayer to dedicate the Temple in Jerusalem? [1 Kings 8:22-53; Praying to God through or toward "this place".]
- 4. Was the Temple in Jerusalem the final and everlasting way to worship God? [He 9:1, 10, 11]

- 6. Today, how do Christians go to God's temple to worship the Lord together? [He 10:25; They habitually go to church, meaning they "assemble" with other Christians for worship.]
- 7. Where does Jesus go to church? [Mt 18:20]

- 8. Why do so many worshipers gather in someone else's name, not in Jesus' name alone? [1 Cor 1:1 through chpts. 4:6; Because of the sin of partiality/favoritism, specifically favoritism towards religious men's names, which is a form of idolatry, naming churches after men, whom are creatures. Yet God will not tolerate it when worshipers give the glory that is due Him to a man (READ Isa 42:8).]
- 9. Through what should Christians pray to God, Jerusalem, the Temple, or what? [Eph 5:20; Jn 14:6]
- 10. Where is "the true tabernacle," or dwelling place of God? [He 8:1, 2]

Are there any other fitting and proper questions about on what our worship is centered or through whom our worship must be offered to the Father?
