3. You Must Eagerly Desire Certain Gifts

For example, Paul said to the Christians in the city of Corinth: "But earnestly desire the **greater** gifts" (1 Corinthians 12:31). And so we see that we should especially desire the "greater gifts". **So then:**

Now, spiritual gifts are talents or abilities which God Himself gives to Christians, in various measure or portions, so that they all can help one another grow spiritually, not sensually and they come in three categories. types, or groupings of gifts. For example, in the context of spiritual gifts (1) Cor 12:1), the Bible says, "But now God has placed the members, each one of them, in the body, just as **He** desired" (1 Cor 12:18). And about the apostles of Christ, God said that He gave them: "gifts of the Holy Spirit according to **His own will**" (He 2:4). And so we see that it is God who gives spiritual gifts, since He is the Spirit, not man, an institution, or even yourself or myself! So, make sure that you mainly seek them from Him, according to His will or desire for you. Next, what is the purpose of spiritual gifts? "Now concerning spiritual gifts, brethren, I do not want you to be unaware... each one is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good" (1 Cor 12:1, 7). "Let all things [regarding use of spiritual gifts in church] be done for edification" (1 Cor 14:26). "And He gave some as apostles, and some as prophets, and some as evangelists, and some as pastors and teachers (gifts), for... the building up of the body of Christ" (Eph 4:11, 12). So, a spiritual gift is not for the individual good of the person who has received it, but for the spiritual benefit or growth of the group. There are three categories of gifts. First, since the Bible says that there are: "the greater gifts" (1 Cor 12:31), there must be gifts which are more powerful in their ability to build up a church, spiritually, than other gifts. If God said that there are "greater gifts", then I am saying that there must be lesser gifts. They are lesser only in the sense of edification power. And so they are still valuable, and necessary, and should be sought after to help the group. And so we can see that there are two categories of spiritual gifts: (1) the Greater Gifts and, (2) the Lesser Gifts. The Greater Gifts are simply the gifts which speak the word of God, that is teachers, such as the apostles and prophets, pastors and evangelists (Refer to Eph 4:7, 11, 15). The Lesser Gifts are simply the gifts which do not speak the word of God, such as the gift of help, giving, miracles, etc. (Refer to 1 Cor 12:28 for a ranking or placement of greater gifts in relation to lesser gifts). The third category of gifts are situational gifts, which are also Lesser Gifts because they do not speak the word of God. For example, the Bible indicates that certain conditions (i.e. situations / see 1 Cor 7:20, 24) in which we find ourselves, are a type of gift, such as being married or unmarried. Paul said, "Yet I wish that all men were even as I myself am [not married]. However, each man has his own gift from God [i.e. married, single, etc.], one in this manner, and another in that" (1 Cor 7:7). There are a lot of Situational Gifts. Were you ever properly taught about the varieties and categories of spiritual gifts and your obligation and responsibility to eagerly seek and use them to build up a church? Do you realize that you have a variety of gifts which you must learn about and use properly in the sight of God? For example, Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ, said to the Christians in the city of Corinth: "Soalso you, since you are zealous of spiritual gifts, seek to abound for the chirch of the church" (all Corinthians 1/41/2). Are you zealous for spiritual gifts? Anyone who wants to build up [edify] a church ought to seek them, fervently. Do you want to build up a church? If so, find out the answer to the question, "What spiritual gifts have I received?". When you complete this self-test worksheet, you will begin to know the exact answer to your question. Now, do you know which spiritual gifts you have received from God? It has everything to do with you properly understanding the variety of gifts which God gave to men and your responsibility to eagerly seek and use them for building up your church.
